16 WHEREAS, upon graduating from Mays High School, 17 Representative Bullard entered the United States Army in which he 18 served until 1969 and then enrolled at Florida Agricultural and 19 Mechanical University where he graduated with a Bachelor's of 20 Science degree in Education and later earned a Master's of 21 Science degree from Florida Agricultural and Mechanical 22 University and Nova University respectively, and

23 WHEREAS, he then returned to Richmond Heights as a probation 24 and parole officer and later to teach in the Miami-Dade County 25 public school system, where he was honored as the "Teacher of the 26 Year," and served for approximately 34 years as a teacher and 27 school administrator, fighting for educational initiatives and 28 instructing many of the children and grandchildren of the 29 community elders with whom he grew up and tossed papers to, and
