An act relating to a public records exception.

An act relating to a public records exemption; creating s. 812.178, F.S.; creating a public records exemption for digital video security camera system recordings made under s. 812.177, F.S.; providing exceptions; providing for future review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity; providing a contingent effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 812.178, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

812.178 Digital video security camera system recordings; public records exemption.--

(1) (a) Digital video security camera system recordings made under s. 812.177 and provided to a law enforcement agency or to any other governmental entity are confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State

Constitution, except as provided in paragraph (b).

(b) The exemption in paragraph (a) does not apply to portions of such recordings admitted as evidence in any criminal or juvenile delinquency proceeding or released to the public as part of a criminal investigation or missing persons investigation.

(2) This section is subject to the Open Government Sunset
Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed

on October 2, 2013, unless reviewed and saved from repeal 29 through reenactment by the Legislature. 30 Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public necessity to make confidential and exempt from public records 31 32 requirements digital video security camera system recordings made under s. 812.177, Florida Statutes, and provided to a law 33 34 enforcement agency or to any other governmental entity, except as provided in s. 812.178(1)(b), Florida Statutes. The 35 36 Legislature finds that it is a public necessity to protect the 37 privacy of persons appearing in business surveillance recordings when such persons are simply visiting a business subject to s. 38 812.177, Florida Statutes, and such visits are recorded as a 39 40 matter of course by such business and subsequently provided to a law enforcement agency or other governmental entity. The 41 Legislature finds that, consistent with s. 23, Art. I of the 42 43 State Constitution, while the recording of the activities of business patrons is needed to deter crime and solve crimes, 44 there is no public interest in the recordings of ordinary 45 46 patrons of businesses where no criminal conduct is involved and 47 that no public purpose would be served by providing the 48 recordings of such ordinary business patrons to the public. 49 Therefore, the Legislature finds that it is a public necessity 50 to prevent the release of such recordings held by law 51 enforcement agencies or other governmental entities, other than as provided in s. 812.178(1)(b), Florida Statutes, and thereby 52 53 makes such information confidential and exempt from the requirements of s. 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and s. 24(a), 54 55 Art. I of the State Constitution.
