20	apply directly to the circuit court of the county wherein such
21	agency is headquartered and permanently resides for an injunction
22	to restrain and enjoin such violation of the provisions of this
23	part and to compel the performance of the duties imposed by this

25	(b) Whose rights under this part are violated may apply
26	directly to the Criminal Justice Standards and Training
27	Commission for an order imposing a fine not to exceed \$10,000 for
28	each violation of any provision of this part. A fine may be
