Section 1. Subsection (11) is added to section 1009.26, Florida Statutes, to read:

1009.26 Fee waivers.--

- (11) (a) A state university or community college shall waive 50 percent of the in-state tuition rate for a person who:
  - 1. Is an honorably discharged veteran;
- Has received a campaign or service medal denoting service in a combat theater of operations, including, but not limited to, service in Iraq and Afghanistan and service in support of the Global War on Terrorism;
- 3. Is enrolled as a full-time, part-time, or summer-school student in an undergraduate program that terminates in a degree or certificate;
- Is a resident of this state at the time he or she applies for the waiver and was a resident of this state at the time of the military action that resulted in the awarding of the campaign or service medal; and

5. Submits to the state university or to the community college the DD-214 form issued at the time of separation from service as documentation that the student has received a Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, Iraq Campaign Medal, or Afghanistan Campaign Medal.

- (b) A waiver under this subsection may be applied to 110 percent of the number of required credit hours of the degree or certificate program for which the student is enrolled.
- (c) Waivers under this subsection shall be funded through the legislative budget process and state universities and community colleges are not responsible for paying the costs of such waivers.
