A bill to be entitled

An act relating to Dennis Gay and Diana Gay, wife of Dennis Gay; providing an appropriation to compensate Dennis and Diana Gay for injuries sustained as a result of the negligence of the Department of Transportation; providing for the use of funds; providing for the reversion of funds to the state; providing for payment by the Chief Financial Officer; providing a limitation on the payment of attorney's fees and lobbying fees and costs; providing an effective date.

WHEREAS, on February 2, 2005, at approximately 7 a.m., Dennis Gay, a 58-year-old man, was a pedestrian in the crosswalk of Brorein Street in Tampa when he was struck by a Department of Transportation vehicle, thrown approximately 27 feet rendering him unconscious, and taken by ambulance to Tampa General Hospital, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Gay was admitted to the hospital in critical condition and diagnosed as having a skull fracture, subarachnoid hemorrhage, subdural hematoma, intracerebral hemorrhage, and left hemiparesis, and the primary neurosurgeon induced a coma to try and control the swelling in Mr. Gay's brain, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Gay was objectively diagnosed by magnetic resonance imaging as having significant brain bleeding, which left him permanently brain-damaged and suffering from impaired cognitive functioning and loss of emotional control, and the neuropsychologist hired by the Department of Transportation to examine Mr. Gay concurred in the finding of permanent brain damage, and

WHEREAS, upon discharge from the hospital several months later in April 2005, Mr. Gay exhibited goal-directed behavior only if cued, was able to relearn old skills such as activities of daily living but memory loss interfered with new learning, had a beginning awareness of self and others, suffered cognitive difficulties and struggled with ambulation, and was unable to negotiate the entry stairs at his home requiring ramp modifications to the premises, and

WHEREAS, Diana Gay, Dennis Gay's wife of 35 years, is left with the care and custody of a significantly disabled man who looks like her husband but no longer acts like her husband, and

WHEREAS, Dennis and Diana Gay filed a lawsuit against the Department of Transportation seeking compensation for injuries and damages sustained, and

WHEREAS, there is no dispute as to the liability of the Department of Transportation, and the department has submitted to a consent judgment in the amount of \$900,000, with Dennis Gay to receive \$600,000 and his wife to receive \$300,000, and

WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation has paid \$100,000 to each claimant pursuant to the limits of liability set forth in s. 768.29, Florida Statutes, and the remainder is conditioned upon the passage of a claim bill by the Legislature in the amount of \$700,000, of which \$500,000 is to be placed in a special needs trust created for the benefit of Dennis Gay, and \$200,000 is to be paid to Diana Gay, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. The facts stated in the preamble to this act are

found and declared to be true.

Section 2. There is appropriated from the General Revenue

Fund to the Department of Transportation as compensation for

injuries and damages sustained by Dennis and Diana Gay due to the

negligence of the department, and as agreed to in a consent

judgment:

- (1) The sum of \$500,000, to be paid to Dennis Gay and placed in a special needs trust created for the use and benefit of Dennis Gay. Any funds remaining in the trust upon the death of Dennis Gay shall revert to the General Revenue Fund; and
 - (2) The sum of \$200,000, to be paid to Diana Gay.

Section 3. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to draw warrants upon funds in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of Transportation in the amount of \$500,000 in favor of Dennis Gay; and the amount of \$200,000 in favor of Diana Gay.

Section 4. Any amount paid by the Department of
Transportation pursuant to the waiver of sovereign immunity
permitted under s. 768.28, Florida Statutes, and this award are
intended to provide the sole compensation for all present and
future claims arising out of the factual situation described in
the preamble to this act which resulted in injuries and damages
to Dennis and Diana Gay. The total amount paid for attorney's
fees, lobbying fees, costs, and other similar expenses relating
to this claim may not exceed 25 percent of the amount awarded
under section 3 of this act.

Section 5. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
