(c) To employ personnel to exercise law enforcement powers, including the investigation of violations of any of the criminal laws of the state occurring on reservations over which the state has assumed jurisdiction pursuant to s. 285.16.

All law enforcement personnel employed shall be 59 considered peace officers for all purposes and shall have the authority to bear arms, make arrests, and apply for, serve, and 61 execute search warrants, arrest warrants, capias, and other 62 process of the court, and to enforce criminal and noncriminal 63 traffic offenses, within their respective special improvement 64 districts.

All law enforcement personnel shall be entitled to the
privileges, protection, and benefits of ss. 112.19 and 870.05.
