A bill to be entitled

An act relating to culpable negligence; providing a short title; amending s. 784.05, F.S.; prohibiting storing or leaving an assault weapon within the reach or easy access of another person if the person obtains the weapon and uses it to inflict injury or death; providing criminal penalties; defining the term "assault weapon"; amending s. 921.0022, F.S.; conforming provisions of the offense severity ranking chart of the Criminal Punishment Code; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. This act may be cited as the "Officer Jose Somohano Assault Weapons Act."

Section 2. Section 784.05, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

784.05 Culpable negligence. --

- $\underline{(1)}$  As used in this <u>section</u> act, the term "minor" means any person under the age of 16.
- (2)(1) Whoever, through culpable negligence, exposes another person to personal injury commits a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.
- $\underline{(3)}$  Whoever, through culpable negligence, inflicts actual personal injury on another commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.

(4)(3) Whoever violates subsection (2) (1) by storing or leaving a loaded firearm within the reach or easy access of a minor commits, if the minor obtains the firearm and uses it to inflict injury or death upon himself or herself or any other person, a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084. However, this subsection does not apply:

- (a) If the firearm was stored or left in a securely locked box or container or in a location which a reasonable person would have believed to be secure, or was securely locked with a trigger lock;
- (b) If the minor obtains the firearm as a result of an unlawful entry by any person;
- (c) To injuries resulting from target or sport shooting accidents or hunting accidents; or
- (d) To members of the Armed Forces, National Guard, or State Militia, or to police or other law enforcement officers, with respect to firearm possession by a minor which occurs during or incidental to the performance of their official duties.

When any minor child is accidentally shot by another family member, no arrest shall be made pursuant to this subsection prior to 7 days after the date of the shooting. With respect to any parent or guardian of any deceased minor, the investigating officers shall file all findings and evidence with the state attorney's office with respect to violations of this subsection. The state attorney shall evaluate such evidence and shall take

such action as he or she deems appropriate under the circumstances and may file an information against the appropriate parties.

- (5) (a) Whoever violates subsection (2) by storing or leaving an assault weapon within the reach or easy access of another person commits, if the person obtains the assault weapon and uses it to inflict injury or death upon himself or herself or any other person, a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084. However, this subsection does not apply:
- 1. If the assault weapon was stored or left in a securely locked box or container or in a location which a reasonable person would have believed to be secure, or was securely locked with a trigger lock;
- 2. If the assault weapon was stolen and the owner reported the theft of the assault weapon to law enforcement authorities within 24 hours of the owner's knowledge of the theft;
- 3. To injuries resulting from target or sport shooting accidents or hunting accidents; or
- 4. To members of the Armed Forces, National Guard, or State Militia, or to police or other law enforcement officers, with respect to assault firearm possession which occurs during or incidental to the performance of their official duties.
- (b)1. For purposes of this subsection, the term "assault weapon" means:
- a. A semiautomatic rifle that has an ability to accept a detachable magazine and has at least two of the following characteristics:
