3	311.12, F.S.; revising the membership of the Seaport
4	Security Standards Advisory Council; amending s. 311.09,
5	F.S.; revising the membership of the Florida Seaport
6	Transportation and Economic Development Council; revising
7	the duties of the Florida Seaport Transportation and
8	Economic Development Council; requiring at least one
9	annual council meeting; requiring an annual analysis and
10	assessment of the economic impact of security on public
11	seaports; requiring an annual report with recommendations
12	to the Legislature; providing an effective date.

14	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

16	Section 1. Paragraph (b) of subsection (8) of section
17	311.12, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
18	311.12 Seaport security standards; inspections; compliance;
19	appeals

21	(b)1. The members of the Seaport Security Standards
22	Advisory Council shall be appointed by the Governor and consist
23	of the following:
24	a. Two seaport directors.
25	b. Two seaport security directors.
26	c. One designee from the Department of Law Enforcement.
27	d. One designee from the Office of Motor Carrier Compliance
28	of the Department of Transportation.
29	e. One designee from the Attorney General's Office.

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30	f. One designee from the Department of Agriculture and
31	Consumer Services.
32	g. One designee from the Office of Tourism, Trade, and
33	Economic Development.
34	h. One designee from the Office of Drug Control.
35	i. Two designees from an organization that represents the
36	tenants of the seaports listed in s. 311.09(1).
37	j. Two designees from a labor organization, as defined in
38	s.447.02, which represents seaport workers at the seaports listed
39	in s. 311.09(1).
40	k. One designee from the Division of Law Enforcement of the
41	Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission.
42	1. Two designees of sheriffs who have law enforcement
43	responsibilities on the seaports listed in s. 311.09(1).
44	m. One designee of a police chief who has law enforcement
45	responsibilities on the seaports listed in s. 311.09(1).
46	2. In addition to the members designated in subparagraph
47	1., the council may invite a representative of the United States
48	Coast Guard to attend and participate in council meetings as an
49	ex officio, nonvoting member of the council.
50	Section 2. Subsection (1) of section 311.09, Florida
51	Statutes, is amended, and subsection (13) is added to that
52	section, to read:
53	311.09 Florida Seaport Transportation and Economic
54	Development Council
55	(1) The Florida Seaport Transportation and Economic
56	Development Council is created within the Department of
57	Transportation. The council consists of the following $\underline{19}$ $\underline{17}$
58	members: the port director, or the port director's designee, of
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59 each of the ports of Jacksonville, Port Canaveral, Fort Pierce, 60 Palm Beach, Port Everglades, Miami, Port Manatee, St. Petersburg, Tampa, Port St. Joe, Panama City, Pensacola, Key West, and 61 62 Fernandina; the secretary of the Department of Transportation or 63 his or her designee; the director of the Office of Tourism, 64 Trade, and Economic Development or his or her designee; and the secretary of the Department of Community Affairs or his or her 65 66 designee; one designee from an organization that represents the 67 tenants of the state's seaports listed in s. 311.09(1); and one 68 designee from a labor organization, as defined in s. 447.02, 69 representing seaport workers at the state's seaports listed in s. 311.09(1). 70 71 (13) (a) The council shall convene at least one meeting 72 annually in order to consult with the appropriate maritime 73 security committees, the Seaport Security Standards Advisory 74 Council, the Department of Law Enforcement, port tenants, and 75 other affected parties, and to analyze and assess actual and 76 possible impacts of seaport security on commerce and trade. 77 (b) Pursuant to paragraph (a), the council shall consider 78 in its analysis the cost of security on the seaports listed in 79 this section. Such analysis shall include, but need not be

80 limited to, the impact of seaport security on seaport operational 81 and capital costs that are the result of requirements enacted by 82 federal law individually, state law individually, and a 83 combination of both federal and state law and shall exclude costs 84 related to the routine business and safety operations of a port; 85 the impact of seaport security costs on the ability of the 86 seaports to fund enhanced commercial operations; the economic

87 impact resulting from actual and potential criminal activity

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88	associated with seaport operations, including cargo theft, human
89	trafficking, and the smuggling of illegal drugs through the
90	public seaports; and the economic impact, including tax revenue
91	loss, to the state of a successful terrorism event at a seaport
92	covered under this section.
93	(c) The council shall make recommendations to promote the
94	flow of legitimate trade and travel through the state's seaports
95	and report its analysis and recommendations to the President of
96	the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives
97	annually.
98	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.
