A bill to be entitled

An act relating to health care in medically underserved areas; amending s. 893.02, F.S.; redefining the term "practitioner" to include an advanced registered nurse practitioner; authorizing an advanced registered nurse practitioner to prescribe certain controlled substances under a protocol with a licensed physician; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsection (19) of section 893.02, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

14 893.02 Definitions.--The following words and phrases as
15 used in this chapter shall have the following meanings, unless
16 the context otherwise requires:

pursuant to chapter 458, a dentist licensed under pursuant to chapter 466, a veterinarian licensed under pursuant to chapter 474, an osteopathic physician licensed under pursuant to chapter 459, a naturopath licensed under pursuant to chapter 462, or a podiatric physician licensed under pursuant to chapter 461, or an advanced registered nurse practitioner certified under s. 464.012 whose practice is located within a medically underserved area or who provides care to a medically underserved population as designated by the Health Resources and Services

Administration of the United States Department of Health and Human Services if provided such practitioner holds a valid

federal controlled substance registry number. An advanced
registered nurse practitioner certified under s. 464.012 whose
practice is located within a medically underserved area or who
provides care to a medically underserved population as
designated by the Health Resources and Services Administration
of the United States Department of Health and Human Services may
prescribe substances listed in Schedule II, Schedule III,
Schedule IV, or Schedule V of s. 893.03 to the extent authorized
by a protocol with a physician licensed under chapter 458 or
chapter 459.

Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
