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8	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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10	Section 1. Section 16.615, Florida Statutes, is amended to
11	read:

14	(1) The Council on the Social Status of Black Men and Boys
15	is established within the Department of Legal Affairs and shall
16	consist of 19 members appointed as follows:
17	(a) Two members of the Senate who are not members of the
18	same political party, appointed by the President of the Senate
19	with the advice of the Minority Leader of the Senate.
20	(b) Two members of the House of Representatives who are not
21	members of the same political party, appointed by the Speaker of
22	the House of Representatives with the advice of the Minority
23	Leader of the House of Representatives.
24	(c) The Secretary of Children and Family Services or his or
25	her designee.
26	(d) The director of the Mental Health Program Office within
27	the Department of Children and Family Services or his or her
28	designee.
29	(e) The <u>Secretary of Health</u> State Surgeon General or his or

(q) The Attorney General or his or her designee. 33 (h) 34 The Secretary of Management Services or his or her (i) 35 designee. 36 (i) The director of the Agency for Workforce Innovation or 37 his or her designee. 38 (k) A businessperson who is an African American, as defined 39 in s. 760.80(2), of black origin appointed by the Governor. 40 (1)Two persons appointed by the President of the Senate 41 who are not members of the Legislature or employed by state 42 government. One of the appointees must be a clinical 43 psychologist. 44 Two persons appointed by the Speaker of the House of (m) 45 Representatives who are not members of the Legislature or 46 employed by state government. One of the appointees must be an 47 Africana studies professional. 48 The deputy secretary for Medicaid in the Agency for (n) 49 Health Care Administration or his or her designee. 50 (0)The Secretary of Juvenile Justice or his or her 51 designee. (2) 52 Each member of the council shall be appointed to a 4-53 year term; however, for the purpose of providing staggered terms, 54 of the initial appointments, 9 members shall be appointed to 2-55 year terms and 10 members shall be appointed to 4-year terms. A 56 member of the council may be removed at any time by the member's 57 appointing authority who shall fill the vacancy on the council. 58 (3) (a) At the first meeting of the council each year, the

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59 members shall elect a chair and a vice chair.

60 (b) A vacancy in the office of chair or vice chair shall be61 filled by vote of the remaining members.

62 (4) (a) The council shall make a systematic study of the 63 conditions affecting black men and boys, including, but not 64 limited to, homicide rates, arrest and incarceration rates, 65 poverty, violence, drug abuse, death rates, disparate annual 66 income levels, school performance in all grade levels including 67 postsecondary levels, and health issues.

(b) The council shall propose measures to alleviate and correct the underlying causes of the conditions described in paragraph (a). These measures may consist of changes to the law or systematic changes that can be implemented without legislative action.

(c) The council may study other topics suggested by theLegislature or as directed by the chair of the council.

(d) The council shall receive suggestions or comments pertinent to the applicable issues from members of the Legislature, governmental agencies, public and private organizations, and private citizens.

(5) The Office of the Attorney General shall provide staffand administrative support to the council.

(6) The council shall meet quarterly and at other times at
the call of the chair or as determined by a majority of council
members and approved by the Attorney General.

84 (7) Eleven of the members of the council shall constitute a
85 quorum, and an affirmative vote of a majority of the members
86 present is required for final action.

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(8) (a) The council shall issue its first annual report by

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December 15, 2007, and by December 15 each following year, stating the findings, conclusions, and recommendations of the council. The council shall submit the report to the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the chairpersons of the standing committees of jurisdiction in each chamber.

94 (b) The initial report must include the findings of an 95 investigation into factors causing black-on-black crime from the 96 perspective of public health related to mental health, other 97 health issues, cultural disconnection, and cultural identity 98 trauma.

99 (9) Members of the council shall serve without 100 compensation. Members are entitled to reimbursement for per diem 101 and travel expenses as provided in s. 112.061. State officers and 102 employees shall be reimbursed from the budget of the agency 103 through which they serve. Other members may be reimbursed by the 104 Department of Legal Affairs.

(10) The council and any subcommittees it forms <u>are shall</u> be subject to the provisions of chapter 119, related to public records, and the provisions of chapter 286, related to public meetings.

(11) Each member of the council who is not otherwise
required to file a financial disclosure statement pursuant to s.
8, Art. II of the State Constitution or s. 112.3144, must file a
disclosure of financial interests pursuant to s. 112.3145.

113 (12) Notwithstanding subsection (6), the Attorney General
114 shall:

115 (a) Within 60 days after the effective date of this act, 116 fix a date for the initial meeting of the council.

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117	(b) Notify each member of the council of the time, date,
118	and place where the initial meeting will be held.
119	(c) Make any other arrangements concerning the initial
120	meeting of the council.
121	(d) Serve as the presiding officer at the initial meeting
122	of the council until a chair is elected.
123	(13) This section expires July 1, 2012, unless reenacted by
124	the Legislature.
125	Section 2. The sum of \$500,000 is appropriated from the
126	General Revenue Fund to the Department of Legal Affairs for the
127	purpose of paying administrative expenses necessary for the
128	Council on the Social Status of Black Men and Boys to carry out
129	its responsibilities under s. 16.615, Florida Statutes, during
130	the 2008-2009 fiscal year.
131	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.
