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9	Section 1. Section 16.615, Florida Statutes, is amended to

13	(1) The Council on the Social Status of Black Men and Boys
14	is established within the Department of Legal Affairs and shall
15	consist of 19 members appointed as follows:
16	(a) Two members of the Senate who are not members of the
17	same political party, appointed by the President of the Senate
18	with the advice of the Minority Leader of the Senate.
19	(b) Two members of the House of Representatives who are not
20	members of the same political party, appointed by the Speaker of
21	the House of Representatives with the advice of the Minority
22	Leader of the House of Representatives.
23	(c) The Secretary of Children and Family Services or his or
24	her designee.
25	(d) The director of the Mental Health Program Office within
26	the Department of Children and Family Services or his or her
27	designee.
28	(e) The State Surgeon General or his or her designee.
29	(f) The Commissioner of Education or his or her designee.

(4) (a) The council shall make a systematic study of the
conditions affecting black men and boys, including, but not
limited to, homicide rates, arrest and incarceration rates,
poverty, violence, drug abuse, death rates, disparate annual
income levels, school performance in all grade levels including
postsecondary levels, and health issues.

(b) The council shall propose measures to alleviate and
correct the underlying causes of the conditions described in
paragraph (a). These measures may consist of changes to the law
or systematic changes that can be implemented without legislative
action.

(c) The council may study other topics suggested by the
Legislature or as directed by the chair of the council.

(d) The council shall receive suggestions or comments pertinent to the applicable issues from members of the Legislature, governmental agencies, public and private organizations, and private citizens.

(5) The Office of the Attorney General shall provide staffand administrative support to the council.

(6) The council shall meet quarterly and at other times at the call of the chair or as determined by a majority of council members and approved by the Attorney General.

82 (7) Eleven of the members of the council shall constitute a
83 quorum, and an affirmative vote of a majority of the members
84 present is required for final action.

(8) (a) The council shall issue its first annual report by
December 15, 2007, and by December 15 each following year,
stating the findings, conclusions, and recommendations of the

88 council. The council shall submit the report to the Governor, the 89 President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of 90 Representatives, and the chairpersons of the standing committees 91 of jurisdiction in each chamber.

92 (b) The initial report must include the findings of an 93 investigation into factors causing black-on-black crime from the 94 perspective of public health related to mental health, other 95 health issues, cultural disconnection, and cultural identity 96 trauma.

97 (9) Members of the council shall serve without
98 compensation. Members are entitled to reimbursement for per diem
99 and travel expenses as provided in s. 112.061. State officers and
100 employees shall be reimbursed from the budget of the agency
101 through which they serve. Other members may be reimbursed by the
102 Department of Legal Affairs.

(10) The council and any subcommittees it forms <u>are shall</u> be subject to the provisions of chapter 119, related to public records, and the provisions of chapter 286, related to public meetings.

107 (11) Each member of the council who is not otherwise
108 required to file a financial disclosure statement pursuant to s.
109 8, Art. II of the State Constitution or s. 112.3144, must file a
110 disclosure of financial interests pursuant to s. 112.3145.

111 (12) Notwithstanding subsection (6), the Attorney General
112 shall:

113 (a) Within 60 days after the effective date of this act, 114 fix a date for the initial meeting of the council.

115 (b) Notify each member of the council of the time, date, 116 and place where the initial meeting will be held.
