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28 The home addresses, telephone numbers, social (d)1. 29 security numbers, and photographs of active or former law enforcement personnel, including correctional and correctional 30 probation officers, personnel of the Department of Children and 31 32 Family Services whose duties include the investigation of abuse, neglect, exploitation, fraud, theft, or other criminal 33 34 activities, personnel of the Department of Health whose duties are to support the investigation of child abuse or neglect, and 35 36 personnel of the Department of Revenue or local governments 37 whose responsibilities include revenue collection and enforcement or child support enforcement; the home addresses, 38 telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and 39 places of employment of the spouses and children of such 40 personnel; and the names and locations of schools and day care 41 42 facilities attended by the children of such personnel are exempt 43 from s. 119.07(1). The home addresses, telephone numbers, and photographs of firefighters certified in compliance with s. 44 633.35; the home addresses, telephone numbers, photographs, and 45 46 places of employment of the spouses and children of such firefighters; and the names and locations of schools and day 47 48 care facilities attended by the children of such firefighters 49 are exempt from s. 119.07(1). 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numbers, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such personnel; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such personnel are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. The home addresses, telephone numbers, social security 89 3. 90 numbers, and photographs of current or former United States attorneys and assistant United States attorneys; the home 91 92 addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and 93 94 children of current or former United States attorneys and assistant United States attorneys; and the names and locations 95 of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of 96 97 current or former United States attorneys and assistant United States attorneys are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. 98 I of the State Constitution. This subparagraph is subject to the 99 Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 100 and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2009, unless reviewed and 101 102 saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

169	Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public
170	necessity that the home addresses and telephone numbers of
171	general magistrates and child support enforcement hearing
172	officers be made confidential and exempt from public records
173	requirements. The Legislature also finds that it is a public
174	necessity that the home addresses, telephone numbers, and places
175	of employment of the spouses, children, and grandchildren of
176	general magistrates and child support enforcement hearing
177	officers and the grandchildren of justices of the Supreme Court,
178	district court of appeal judges, circuit court judges, and
179	county court judges be made confidential and exempt from public
180	records requirements. The Legislature also finds that it is a
181	public necessity that the names and locations of schools and day
182	care facilities attended by the children and grandchildren of
183	general magistrates and child support enforcement hearing
184	officers and the grandchildren of justices of the Supreme Court,
185	district court of appeal judges, circuit court judges, and
186	county court judges be made confidential and exempt from public
187	records requirements. Release of such identifying and location
188	information might place such judicial officials and their family
189	members in danger of physical and emotional harm from
190	disgruntled criminal defendants or litigants. Therefore, the
191	harm that might result from the release of the information
192	outweighs any public benefit that could be derived from
193	disclosure of the information.
194	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.
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
