Chapter 598, Florida Statutes, consisting of sections 598.001, 598.002, 598.003, 598.004, 598.005, 598.006, 21 598.007, 598.008, 598.009, and 598.011, is created to read: 22 23 CHAPTER 598 24 ARBORICULTURE 25 598.001 Short title.--This chapter may be cited as the 26 "Florida Arborist Licensing Law." Purpose.--It is declared to be the public policy 27 598.002 of the state that, in order to safeguard life, health, and 28 Page 1 of 8

35	598.003 DefinitionsAs used in this chapter:
36	(1) "Arboriculture" or "arboriculture services" means:
37	(a) Any tree service, including, but not limited to, a
38	written or oral report, a recommendation, an opinion, or a
39	consultation done for compensation relating to the improvement
40	of the condition of shade, ornamental, palm, or fruit trees by
41	fertilizing, pruning, trimming, bracing, or other methods of
42	improving, diagnosing, or protecting such trees from tree pests,
43	excluding activities regulated under chapter 482 and the
44	activities of a nursery as defined in s. 581.011(20) and (22),
45	or diagnosing or protecting such trees from tree diseases and
46	abiotic agents, or curing or repairing any damage to such trees,
47	including, but not limited to, pruning, removal, preservation,
48	repair, cabling and bracing, lightning protection, root pruning,
49	root excavation, tree assessments, tree maintenance and care,
50	trimming, cutting, sawing, or removal of trees that have been
51	damaged to such an extent as to cause or threaten injury to life
52	or property.
53	(b) A service performed in connection with post-storm
54	cleanup of damage from hurricanes, tropical storms, and other
55	storm events that involves substantial work hours. A post-storm
56	cleanup service includes, but is not limited to, storm damage
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57	resulting in downed, damaged, or uprooted trees, or parts of
58	trees, of substantial size and weight in excess of 50 pounds
59	that threaten the structural integrity of residential or
60	commercial structures; involve any type of power lines; impede
61	traffic on streets, driveways, and other vehicular access roads;
62	require extensive use of compression or chain saws; and involve
63	any related skilled service.
64	(c) A landscape architect licensed under part II of
65	chapter 481 is authorized to practice arboriculture; however, as
66	provided in s. 598.006(4), only a person licensed under this
67	chapter may hold herself or himself out as a state-licensed
68	arborist.
69	(2) "Arborist of record" means a Florida-licensed arborist
70	in good standing who is employed by or contracting with a firm,
71	corporation, partnership, employer, or person; who supervises
72	employees providing arboriculture services; and who issues
73	authorization cards to persons performing services under her or
74	his supervision.
75	(3) "Department" means the Department of Agriculture and
76	Consumer Services.
77	(4) "Landscape tree maintenance" means maintenance
78	performed when standing on the ground or when performed on trees
79	less than 4 inches in diameter at breast height as defined by
80	the most current edition of the Guide to Plant Appraisal.
81	(5) "Licensed arborist" means a person who has fulfilled
82	the International Society of Arboriculture requirements for
83	arborist certification or for certification as a Board Certified
84	Master Arborist, whose certification is current, and who meets
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85 the requirements of s. 598.006. 86 (6) "Person" means a person as defined in s. 1.01(3). "Practice of arboriculture" means the performance of, 87 (7)88 or offer to perform, an arboriculture service, including, but 89 not limited to, a written or oral report, consultation, 90 investigation, evaluation, or planning, relating to 91 arboriculture, excluding landscape tree maintenance as defined 92 in this section and as otherwise excluded by this chapter. 140 (1) Each applicant for licensure shall:
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141 (a) Submit to the department an application for licensure that has been reviewed by the Florida Chapter, Board of 142 143 Directors, International Society of Arboriculture, Inc., for completeness and compliance with this section, together with the 144 145 nonrefundable fee; 146 Furnish proof that she or he is at least 18 years of (b) 147 age; (c) Disclose any act or offense or investigation of such 148 act or offense in any jurisdiction related to the applicant's 149 150 ability to practice arboriculture; (d) 151 Submit evidence of current certification by the 152 International Society of Arboriculture as a Certified Arborist 153 or as a Board Certified Master Arborist; 154 Provide proof of liability, required workers' (e) compensation, and errors and omissions insurance; however, an 155 156 applicant employed by a statutorily recognized governmental 157 entity shall not be required to carry errors and omissions 158 insurance or liability insurance if the entity is self-insured. 159 Within 30 days after the termination of the person's employment 160 with the governmental entity, the person shall fully comply with 161 the requirements of this subsection; and 162 Submit a signed statement that the applicant will (f) 163 comply with current industry standards, including, but not 164 limited to, ANSI Z-133-1 and A-300 series and any other related standards of the International Society of Arboriculture and best 165 management practices adopted by rule by the department. 166 (2) 167 The department, if it has knowledge, shall not issue a 168 license to any applicant who has committed an act or offense or

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169	who is under investigation pending its outcome in any
170	jurisdiction for an offense related to her or his ability to

172	(3) Any person licensed under this section who fails to
173	maintain compliance with subsection (1) shall have her or his
174	license suspended or revoked by the department.
175	(4) A person may not hold herself or himself out as a
176	licensed Florida arborist unless the person has been issued a
177	license pursuant to this chapter.
178	(5) All final arboriculture papers or documents involving
179	the practice of the profession of arboriculture under the
180	supervision of a Florida-licensed arborist of record that have
181	been prepared or approved for use by a firm, corporation,
182	partnership, or person, for delivery to any person for public
183	record within the state, shall be dated and bear the signature
184	and seal of the Florida-licensed arborist of record who
185	prepared, supervised, or approved the documents and who was
186	responsible for the supervision of persons performing
187	arboricultural services.
188	598.007 Renewal of licenses; notice of address of primary
189	place of business
190	(1) The department shall renew a license upon receipt of
191	satisfactory evidence that the applicant's International Society
192	of Arboriculture certification is current and that the applicant
193	is otherwise in compliance with this chapter and department
194	rules.
195	(2) The licensed arborist must have on file with the
196	department the address of her or his primary place of practice.
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197 Within 30 days after changing the address of her or his primary 198 place of practice, the licensed arborist must notify the 199 department of the address of the new primary place of practice. 200 598.008 Inactive licenses; reactivated licenses; suspended 201 or revoked licenses. -- A licensed arborist whose license has become inactive, suspended, or revoked shall have her or his 202 203 license reactivated only upon written request to the department 204 and approval by the department to reactivate the license. 598.009 Lost, destroyed, stolen, or mutilated licenses.--A 205 duplicate license for a licensed arborist may be issued to 206 replace a license that has been lost, destroyed, stolen, or 207 mutilated, subject to rules of the department. Licenses issued 208 under this section shall be marked with the word "DUPLICATE." 209 210 598.011 Roster of licensed arborists.--The department shall maintain a roster showing the names and places of business 211 212 of all licensed arborists in the state, based on requests for 213 licensure. 214 Section 2. There is hereby appropriated to the Department 215 of Agriculture and Consumer Services one position and associated 216 rate and expenses of \$72,280 from the Incidental Trust Fund in 217 order to carry out the provisions of this act. 218 Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.

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
