34 <u>2.</u> If a foster parent applicant does not receive a foster 35 parent license, the information made exempt pursuant to this 36 paragraph shall become public 5 years after the date of 37 application, except that social security numbers and medical 38 records shall remain exempt from the provisions of s. 119.07(1) 39 and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution.

40 <u>3.</u> This exemption applies to information made exempt by 41 this paragraph before, on, or after the effective date of the 42 exemption.

(b)<u>1.</u> The following information held by the Department of Children and Family Services regarding a licensed foster parent and the foster parent's spouse, minor child, and other adult household member is exempt from the provisions of s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution, unless otherwise ordered by a court:

I of the State Constitution.
