46 (1)There is created a standing joint committee of the 47 Legislature, designated the Committee on Public Counsel Service Commission Oversight, and composed of 12 members appointed as 48 49 follows: six members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate, two of whom must be members of the minority party; 50 and six members of the House of Representatives appointed by the 51 Speaker of the House of Representatives, two of whom must be 52 members of the minority party. The terms of members shall be for 53 2 years and shall run from the organization of one Legislature 54 55 to the organization of the next Legislature.
