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(e) As used in this subsection, the term: 1. "High-capacity detachable box magazine" means any detachable box magazine, for use in a semiautomatic firearm, which is capable of being loaded with more than 20 centerfire cartridges.

122 2. "Semiautomatic firearm" means a firearm which is capable 123 of firing a series of rounds by separate successive depressions 124 of the trigger and which uses the energy of discharge to perform 125 a portion of the operating cycle.
