Section 2. Office of State Diabetes Coordinator. --

- (1) OFFICE CREATED; APPOINTMENT.--The office of State

 Diabetes Coordinator is created within the office of the Deputy

 State Health Officer. The State Diabetes Coordinator shall be

 appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the Surgeon General,

 and shall report directly to the Surgeon General.
 - (2) DUTIES.--The State Diabetes Coordinator shall:
- (a) Serve as the principal advisor to the Surgeon General on ways to save lives, improve the quality of life, and reduce costs for taxpayers, patients, and others by reducing the incidence of diabetes and its complications.

- (b) Review and report on any existing means for measuring the incidence of diabetes in this state and recommend means of measuring the incidence of diabetes to the extent that such means are not currently in place.
- (c) Develop and coordinate implementation of a statewide strategy to reduce the incidence, progression, and impact of diabetes and its complications.
- (d) Provide leadership and coordination between state agencies, local agencies, the nonprofit sector, and the private sector to improve coordination of federal, state, local, and voluntary agencies for the purpose of reducing duplication of effort, maximizing impact, and marshalling public resources.
- (e) Coordinate public and private resources to develop and lead a public awareness campaign regarding the prevention and control of diabetes and its complications.
- Section 3. <u>Statewide strategy for the prevention and</u> control of diabetes.--
- (1) No later than October 1 of each year, the Surgeon General, in consultation with the State Diabetes Coordinator, shall provide a report to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives describing the statewide strategy to reduce the incidence, progression, and impact of diabetes and its complications, including such recommendations for legislation as the Surgeon General deems appropriate.
- (2) No later than October 1 of each year, the Commissioner of Agriculture and Consumer Services shall provide a report to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of 023413
