A bill to be entitled 1 2 An act relating to transitional services for young adults 3 with disabilities; creating a health care transition services task force within the Department of Health; 4 providing legislative intent; providing for membership, 5 duties, and responsibilities of the task force; providing 6 7 for reimbursement of members for expenses; requiring the Legislature to allocate funds to the task force; requiring 8 9 the task force to assess the need for health care transition services and provide a report to the Governor 10 and the Legislature; creating the Don Davis Health and 11 Transition Services Program of Jacksonville; assigning the 12 program for administrative purposes to the Children's 13 Medical Services Network within the Department of Health; 14 providing purposes of the program; describing 15 16 participating service providers and the services to be 17 provided; providing for an evaluation of the program; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date. 18 19 20 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 21 Health Care Transition Services Task Force for 22 Section 1. Youth and Young Adults with Disabilities; membership, duties, 23 24 and responsibilities.--25 (1)The Department of Health shall create a statewide 26 Health Care Transition Services Task Force for Youth and Young Adults with Disabilities. It is the intent of the Legislature 27 that the task force assess the need for health care transition 28

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29 services for youth and young adults with disabilities, develop 30 strategies to ensure successful transition from the pediatric to the adult health care system, and identify existing and 31 32 potential funding sources. The task force shall be composed of 15 members. The task force shall have representatives from at 33 least three geographic areas in the state representing rural, 34 35 suburban, and urban areas. 36 The task force shall be composed of the following (2) 37 persons: The Deputy Secretary for Children's Medical Services 38 (a) 39 within the Department of Health or his or her designee. (b) A representative from the children's health care 40 41 medical community. 42 A representative from the adult health care medical (C) 43 community. 44 (d) The director of the Agency for Persons with 45 Disabilities or his or her designee. 46 Two representatives of associations that advocate for (e) 47 persons who have chronic medical conditions or disabilities, such as the American Diabetes Association, the Sickle Cell 48 49 Foundation, the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation, United Cerebral 50 Palsy, the Spina Bifida Association, or the Down Syndrome 51 Association. 52 Two young adults who have chronic health problems or (f) developmental disabilities or a family member. 53 The deputy commissioner of the Division of Vocational 54 (q) Rehabilitation within the Department of Education or his or her 55 56 designee.

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57	(h) The Commissioner of Education or his or her designee.
58	(i) The Secretary of Health Care Administration or his or
59	her designee.
60	(j) The Director of Children's Medical Services or his or
61	her designee.
62	(k) A representative of a medical school.
63	(1) A person appointed by the President of the Senate.
64	(m) A person appointed by the Speaker of the House of

66	(3) The Deputy Secretary for Children's Medical Services
67	or his or her designee shall be the chair of the task force. The
68	Department of Health shall provide staff support to the task
69	force. Task force members shall serve without compensation but
70	are entitled to reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses
71	incurred as provided in s. 112.061, Florida Statutes, in
72	carrying out their duties. Members who are public officers or
73	employees shall be reimbursed through the budget entity through
74	which they are compensated.
75	(4) The task force shall:
76	(a) Convene by August 31, 2008.
77	(b) Obtain input from key stakeholders, community
78	stakeholders, public agencies, the medical practice community,
79	and youth and young adults who have chronic special health care
80	needs or disabilities and their families to assess the need for
81	health care transition services and to identify barriers that
82	impede access to comprehensive medical treatment and health care
83	for youth and young adults who have chronic special health care
84	needs or disabilities.

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2008 85 (c) Develop a statewide plan to promote the development of 86 health care transition services. The plan should put forth 87 different models that accommodate the geographic and cultural 88 diversity in the state and that are adapted to the local needs 89 of communities and to local health services delivery systems. 90 Furthermore, the plan should promote the integration of health 91 care transition services with transition programs for education, vocational rehabilitation, and independent living. 92 93 (d) Identify common or comparable performance measures for all entities that serve the needs for health care transition 94 95 services of youth and young adults who have chronic special health care needs or disabilities. 96 Collect and disseminate information concerning best 97 (e) 98 practices in health care transition services for youth and young 99 adults who have chronic special health care needs or 100 disabilities. Identify existing and potential funding sources to 101 (f) 102 create health care transition services within communities. 103 (5) The Legislature shall allocate up to \$100,000 to 104 offset expenses incurred by the activities of the task force. 105 The task force shall present a final report of its findings and 106 recommendations to the Governor, the President of the Senate, 107 and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by January 1, 108 2009. The Don Davis Health and Transition Services 109 Section 2. Program of Jacksonville; creation; purposes; participating 110 agencies and services provided; evaluation .--111 The Don Davis Health and Transition Services Program 112 (1) Page 4 of 7

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113 of Jacksonville is created for the purpose of assisting youth and young adults who have special needs relating to health care 114 115 and educational and vocational rehabilitation services in making a smooth transition from the children's health care and 116 117 educational system to the adult health care system and to 118 employment. For administrative purposes, the program shall be located in the Children's Medical Services Network within the 119 120 Department of Health. The program shall provide services for persons who are 121 (2) 14 through 26 years of age residing in Baker, Clay, Duval, 122 123 Nassau, and St. Johns Counties and who have chronic special 124 health care needs or developmental disabilities. 125 The following elements must be in place in order to (3) 126 ensure the success of the Don Davis Health and Transition Services Program of Jacksonville: 127 A consultative partnership between adult and pediatric 128 (a) 129 health care providers in a major medical health care 130 organization or academic medical setting for the purpose of 131 training and transferring adolescents and young adults to adult 132 health care services. 133 (b) A primary care clinic established in a major medical 134 health care organization for the purpose of fostering the 135 partnership between adult and pediatric health care providers. 136 (c) Community-based health care services that are provided pursuant to agreements with major health care organizations or 137 academic medical centers for purposes of providing consultation 138 concerning the management of special health care needs. 139 140 (d) Community-based support organizations that can provide

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141 assistance with services such as supported living and employment, health insurance, and support services to maintain 142 143 the young adult in the community. (4) The following services shall be offered to individuals 144 145 who are enrolled in the Don Davis Health and Transition Services 146 Program of Jacksonville: 147 (a) An assessment of health needs, educational and vocational status and needs, and health insurance status. 148 149 (b) In coordination with the educational system, community-based organizations, and the vocational system, a plan 150 151 for transition that includes adult health care services, 152 education, habilitative services, independent living, adult 153 employment, and health insurance. 154 A medical home that provides for coordinated and (C) multidisciplinary care and focuses on engaging adult health care 155 156 providers in the care and treatment of the adolescent or young 157 adult. 158 (d) Self-management of specific health conditions, 159 preventive health services, and the use of primary care and 160 specialty health care services. 161 (5) The Don Davis Health and Transition Services Program 162 of Jacksonville shall be codirected by two physicians having experience in pediatric and adult health care. A project 163 164 coordinator shall assist the physicians in developing and implementing the program. A nurse coordinator shall provide care 165 coordination services. Other staff may be included in order to 166 167 provide a full range of health and transition services.

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168 (6) The Don Davis Health and Transition Services Program of Jacksonville shall conduct an evaluation that is formative 169 170 and cumulative and must include program process and outcome measures as well as client outcomes. The results of the 171 172 evaluation may be used to improve and develop other health and 173 transition programs statewide. 174 Section 3. The sum of \$650,000 is appropriated from the 175 General Revenue Fund to the Children's Medical Services Network 176 within the Department of Health for operational and expansion costs for the Don Davis Health and Transition Services Program 177 178 of Jacksonville during the 2008-2009 fiscal year. 179 Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.

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
