85 1009.536 Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars award.--The 86 Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars award is created within 87 the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program to recognize and 88 reward academic achievement and career preparation by high 89 school students who wish to continue their education.

A Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholar is eligible for 90 (2) 91 an award equal to the amount required to pay 55 75 percent of tuition and fees, if the student is enrolled in a public 92 postsecondary education institution, or, if while so enrolled 93 the student is pursuing a major in the field of science, 94 technology, engineering, mathematics, education, or nursing or 95 another health profession, he or she is eligible for an award 96 equal to the amount required to pay 85 percent of tuition and 97 fees.
