that was not counted, attempted to vote by provisional ballot 47 that was not counted, or did not vote. 48 49 (c) Within 60 days after a general election, the department shall send to the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the 50 51 House of Representatives, the Senate Minority Leader, and the 52 House Minority Leader a report in electronic format that includes 53 all information set forth in paragraph (b). (2) PRECINCT-LEVEL ELECTION RESULTS. -- Within 45 days after 54 55 the date of a presidential preference primary election, a special 56 election, or a general election, the supervisors of elections 57 shall collect and submit to the department precinct-level 58 election results for the election in a uniform electronic format 59 specified by the department. The precinct-level election results shall be compiled separately for the primary or special primary 60 election that preceded the general or special general election, 61 62 respectively. The results shall specifically include for each 63 precinct the aggregate total of all ballots cast for each candidate or nominee to fill a national, state, county or 64 65 district office or proposed constitutional amendment. "All ballots cast" means ballots cast by voters who cast a ballot 66 whether at a precinct location, by absentee ballot including 67 68 overseas absentee ballots, during the early voting period, or by 69 provisional ballot. 70 (3) PRECINCT-LEVEL BOOK CLOSING STATISTICS .-- After the 71 date of book closing but before the date of an election as 72 defined in s. 97.021(10) to fill a national, state, county, or 73 district office, or to vote on a proposed constitutional 74 amendment, the department shall compile the following precinct-75 level statistical data for each county: 76 (a) Precinct numbers.
