WHEREAS, Adelle Vaughn-Jemison, an Ocala native and wellknown educator and activist in Pinellas County, died on November 19, 2007, at 77 years of age, and

WHEREAS, for nearly 40 years, Adelle Vaughn-Jemison devoted her life to equality, children, and education, serving as a child welfare worker for the City of St. Petersburg, a social worker for the Pinellas County School System, and an assistant superintendent for the school system's Office of Equal Opportunity, and

WHEREAS, in 1968, after a St. Petersburg sanitation workers' strike, Adelle Vaughn-Jemison helped found the St. Petersburg Area Chamber of Commerce's Community Alliance, an organization charged with bridging the gap between the city's white and black residents, and

WHEREAS, while tackling inequality in the school system, Adelle Vaughn-Jemison became involved in promoting public safety and, in 1979, joined the St. Petersburg Police Department's Community Police Council where she remained an active member until her death, and

WHEREAS, in 2002, Adelle Vaughn-Jemison helped form the Concerned Organizations for Quality Education for Black Students, a St. Petersburg group which continues to work with the Pinellas County School District to narrow the academic
