House Resolution

A resolution designating March 12, 2008, as "Florida Oceans Day."

WHEREAS, with 1,350 miles of coastline, Florida has the second longest coastline among the 50 states in the nation, and

WHEREAS, the gross state product of Florida's shoreline economy is estimated to be approximately \$402 billion annually, more than two and a half times the estimated \$160 billion gross state product of its inland economy, and represents 77 percent of the state's total economy, and

WHEREAS, by the year 2015, ocean tourism and recreation in Florida is projected to grow by 73 percent, creating more than 268,000 new jobs, and

WHEREAS, from 1990 to 2003, Florida's coastal counties increased employment by 31 percent, increased wages by 48 percent, and increased the gross state product by 63 percent, at rates exceeding those for the State of California, the Gulf States, and the nation, and

WHEREAS, Florida's oceans and coastal resources are held in trust for the people of the state and should be managed for the benefit of current and future generations, and

WHEREAS, because Florida's welfare and the welfare of its citizens is so greatly dependent upon the health and proper management of its ocean and coastal systems, it has benefited the state to work with such entities as the Florida Oceans and Coastal Council, the Florida Ocean Alliance, and the Florida

Coastal and Ocean Coalition to improve the stewardship of this invaluable resource, and

WHEREAS, Florida's coastal counties account for more than 70 percent of the state's employment, population, and housing, though they comprise only 56 percent of the land area of the state, and

WHEREAS, Florida ranks as the number one travel destination in the United States for Americans who swim, fish, dive, and use the state's beaches, coastal wetlands, and shores, and

WHEREAS, Florida's economy relies heavily on its oceans and shorelines and Floridians must actively use them in a sustainable manner to ensure a continuing strong economy for the future, and

WHEREAS, on Wednesday, March 12th, in the Capitol
Courtyard, the Florida Ocean Alliance, the Florida Institute of
Oceanography, and the Mote Marine Laboratory will present
educational exhibits from institutions around the State of
Florida with the theme of "Ocean Technology: Protecting
Florida's Oceans/Sustaining Florida's Economy, "NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Florida:

That the House of Representatives, in recognition of the influence that Florida's abundant and healthy oceans have on the lives of Floridians, urges all Floridians to act as good stewards of this priceless resource and in support of such efforts designates March 12, 2008, as "Florida Oceans Day."
