A resolution designating March 26, 2008, as "Spanish Language Journalism Day in honor of Justo de Lara" in the State of Florida.

WHEREAS, Jose de Armas y Cardenas, who wrote under the pseudonym of Justo de Lara, was a distinguished journalist, poet, and author in whose name the Justo de Lara Prize for Spanish Journalistic Excellence, the most prestigious award of its kind in Cuba, was awarded from 1934 until 1959 by El Encanto Department Stores, and

WHEREAS, Jose de Armas y Cardenas was born on March 26, 1866, in Guanabacoa, Cuba, to Jose de Armas y Cespedes, the editor of La Nacion newspaper, and Fermina de Cardenas, one of the forerunners of the Cuban Feminism movement, who founded and became editor of the Pink Pages newspaper, and

WHEREAS, although educated as an attorney, Jose de Armas y Cardenas chose to work with his father on La Nacion, where he began his illustrious journalistic career, and

WHEREAS, Jose de Armas y Cardenas' fluency in Spanish, Italian, French, and English and his propensity for reading and love of literature fueled his own desire to write, and

WHEREAS, Jose de Armas y Cardenas was a prolific author and noted as one of the most distinguished Cervantes scholars of his era, and

WHEREAS, as a journalist, Jose de Armas y Cardenas founded and directed La Avispa magazine in Havana and in New York, founded and directed the El Peregrino magazine in Madrid, Spain, HR 9073 2008

and served as a correspondent for The Sun and the New York Herald newspapers, and

WHEREAS, Jose de Armas y Cardenas worked during the Spanish-American War as a special envoy for The Sun in 1898, serving as an official translator between Cuban General Calixto Garcia and Lt. Colonel Theodore Roosevelt, and in 1908 he worked as a special envoy for the New York Herald in Haiti, helping the troops overcome the language barrier, and

WHEREAS, Jose de Armas y Cardenas received numerous honors and awards, including being decorated with the Order of the Caballero Gran Cruz de Isabel la Catolica by the Spanish Government and being awarded the Commemorative Medal of the Spanish-American War by the United States Government, and

WHEREAS, Jose de Armas y Cardenas was the only person of Spanish-speaking origin named by the Government of England in 1916 to be a member of the commission responsible for the tricentennial celebration of William Shakespeare, one of the authors he admired, many of whose sonnets he had translated into Spanish, and

WHEREAS, Jose de Armas y Cardenas was a member of the Hispanic Society of America, the Real Academy of the Spanish Language, and the Academy for Cuban History, and

WHEREAS, Jose de Armas y Cardenas, known as "Justo de Lara," died in 1919 in Havana, Cuba, but continued to serve posthumously as an example to all who strove to attain journalistic and literary acclaim, and in whose name the award for Spanish Journalistic Excellence was given in Cuba from 1934 to 1959, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Florida:

That March 26, 2008, is designated as "Spanish Language Journalism Day in honor of Justo de Lara," in recognition of the excellence in journalism that Jose de Armas y Cardenas achieved during his life and his love of literature in Spanish and other languages, of the excellence in journalism that the award in his honor continued to recognize after his death, and of the hope for such continued excellence today and in the future.
