(1) This act may be cited as the "Florida 2008 37 Title Insurance Study Advisory Council Act." (2) The purpose of this act is to create an advisory 38 council to undertake a comprehensive examination of the title 39 insurance delivery system of this state with the ultimate goal 40 of making recommendations for legislation to promote a sound and 41 stable system to promote the safety of real property transfers 42 43 in this state. 44 (3) The Florida 2008 Title Insurance Study Advisory Council is created.
