A bill to be entitled

An act relating to transitional services for young adults with disabilities; creating a health care transition services task force within the Department of Health; providing legislative intent; providing for membership, duties, and responsibilities of the task force; providing for reimbursement of members for expenses; requiring the Legislature to allocate funds to the task force; requiring the task force to assess the need for health care transition services and provide a report to the Governor and the Legislature; creating the Don Davis Health and Transition Services Program of Jacksonville; assigning the program for administrative purposes to the Children's Medical Services Network within the Department of Health; providing purposes of the program; describing participating service providers and the services that they are to provide; providing for an evaluation of the program; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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- Section 1. Health Care Transition Services Task Force for Youth and Young Adults with Disabilities; membership, duties, and responsibilities.--
- 26 (1) The Department of Health shall create a statewide
 27 Health Care Transition Services Task Force for Youth and Young
 28 Adults with Disabilities. It is the intent of the Legislature
 29 that the task force assess the need for health care transition

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services for youth with disabilities, develop strategies to ensure successful transition from the pediatric to the adult health care system, and identify existing and potential funding sources. The task force shall be composed of 13 members. The task force shall have representatives from at least three geographic areas in the state, representing rural, suburban, and urban areas.

- (2) The task force shall be composed of the following persons:
- (a) The director of the Division of Children's Medical Services Network within the Department of Health or his or her designee.
- (b) A representative from the children's health care medical community.
- (c) A representative from the adult health care medical community.
- (d) The director of the Agency for Persons with Disabilities or his or her designee.
- (e) Two representatives of associations that advocate for persons who have chronic medical conditions or disabilities, such as the American Diabetes Association, the Sickle Cell Foundation, the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation, United Cerebral Palsy, the Spina Bifida Association, or the Down Syndrome Association.
- (f) Two young adults who have chronic health problems or developmental disabilities or a family member.
- (g) The deputy commissioner of the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation within the Department of Education or his or her designee.
 - (h) The Commissioner of Education or his or her designee.

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(i) The Secretary of Health Care Administration or his or her designee.

- (j) A person appointed by the President of the Senate.
- (k) A person appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- Services Network or his or her designee shall be the chairperson of the task force. The Department of Health shall provide staff support to the task force. Task force members shall serve without compensation, but are entitled to reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses incurred as provided in s. 112.061, Florida Statutes, in carrying out their duties. Members who are public officers or employees shall be reimbursed through the budget entity through which they are compensated.
 - (4) The task force shall:
 - (a) Convene by August 31, 2008.
- (b) Obtain input from key stakeholders, community stakeholders, public agencies, the medical practice community, and youth who have chronic special health care needs and disabilities and their families to assess the need for health care transition services and to identify barriers that impede access to comprehensive medical treatment and health care for youth and young adults who have chronic special health care needs and disabilities.
- (c) Develop a statewide plan to promote the development of health care transition services. The plan should put forth different models that accommodate the geographic and cultural diversity in the state and that are adapted to the local needs of communities and to local health services delivery systems.

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Furthermore, the plan should promote the integration of health care transition services with transition programs for education, vocation, and independent living.

- (d) Identify common or comparable performance measures for all entities that serve the needs for health care transition services of youth and young adults who have chronic special health care needs and disabilities.
- (e) Collect and disseminate information concerning best practices in health care transition services for youth and young adults who have chronic special health care needs and disabilities.
- (f) Identify existing and potential funding sources to create health care transition services within communities.
- (5) The Legislature shall allocate up to \$100,000 to offset expenses incurred by the activities of the task force. The task force shall present a final report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by January 1, 2009.
- Section 2. The Don Davis Health and Transition Services

 Program of Jacksonville; creation; purposes; participating

 agencies and services provided; evaluation.--
- (1) The Don Davis Health and Transition Services Program of Jacksonville is created for the purpose of assisting adolescents and young adults who have special needs relating to health care and educational and vocational services in making a smooth transition from the child health care and educational system to the adult health care system and to employment. For administrative purposes, the program shall be located in the Division of Children's Medical Services Network within the

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117 Department of Health.

- (2) The program shall provide services for persons who are 14 through 26 years of age residing in Baker, Clay, Duval, Nassau, and St. Johns Counties and who have chronic special health care needs or developmental disabilities.
- (3) The following elements must be in place in order to ensure the success of the Don Davis Health and Transition
 Services Program of Jacksonville:
- (a) A consultative partnership between adult and pediatric health care providers in a major medical health care organization or academic medical setting for the purpose of training and transferring adolescents and young adults to adult health care services.
- (b) A primary care clinic established in a major medical health care organization for the purpose of fostering the partnership between adult and pediatric health care providers.
- (c) Community-based health care services that are provided pursuant to agreements with major health care organizations or academic medical centers for purposes of providing consultation concerning the management of special health care needs.
- (d) Community-based support organizations that can provide assistance with services such as supported living and employment, health insurance, and support services to maintain the young adult in the community.
- (4) The following services shall be offered to individuals who are enrolled in the Don Davis Health and Transition Services

 Program of Jacksonville:
- (a) An assessment of health needs, educational and vocational status and needs, and health insurance status.

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(b) In coordination with the educational system, community-based organizations, and the vocational system, a plan for transition which includes adult health services, education, habilitative services, independent living, adult employment, and health insurance.

- (c) A medical home that provides for coordinated and multidisciplinary care and focuses on engaging adult health care providers in the care and treatment of the adolescent or young adult.
- (d) Self-management of specific health conditions, preventive health services, and the use of primary care and specialty health care services.
- (5) The Don Davis Health and Transition Services Program of Jacksonville shall be codirected by two physicians having experience in pediatric and adult health care. A project coordinator shall assist the physicians in developing and implementing the program. A nurse coordinator shall provide care coordination services. Other staff may be included in order to provide a full range of health and transition services.
- (6) The Don Davis Health and Transition Services Program of Jacksonville shall conduct an evaluation that is formative and cumulative and must include program process and outcome measures as well as client outcomes. The results of the evaluation may be used to improve and develop other health and transition programs statewide.
- Section 3. The sum of \$650,000 is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Division of Children's Medical Services Network within the Department of Health for operational and expansion costs during the 2008-2009 fiscal year.
