and is enrolled in Medicare Part part B.; or

- (b) To any individual who is 65 years of age or older, or younger than 65 years of age and eligible for Medicare due to having a disability or end-stage renal disease, and is enrolled in Medicare Part part B, who resides in this state, upon the request of the individual during the 2-month period following termination of coverage under a group health insurance policy.
- (c) To any individual residing in this state who is younger than 65 years of age, who is eligible for Medicare due to having a disability or end-stage renal disease and otherwise eligible under this subsection, who first enrolled in Medicare Part B before July 1, 2009, and who requests the opportunity to enroll in a Medicare supplement policy on or before January 1, 2010.

A Medicare supplement policy issued to an individual under paragraph (a), or paragraph (b), or paragraph (c) may not exclude benefits based on
