1. Not attempting in good faith to settle claims when, under all the circumstances, it could and should have done so, had it acted fairly and honestly toward its insured and with due regard for her or his interests;

33 2. Making claims payments to insureds or beneficiaries not 34 accompanied by a statement setting forth the coverage under 35 which payments are being made; or

36 3. Except as to liability coverages, failing to promptly 37 settle claims, when the obligation to settle a claim has become 38 reasonably clear, under one portion of the insurance policy 39 coverage in order to influence settlements under other portions 40 of the insurance policy coverage.
