10	Section 1. Section 373.073, Florida Statutes, is amended to

13	(1) (a) The governing board of each water management
14	district shall be composed of 9 <u>elected</u> members who <u>must</u> shall
15	reside within the district, except that the Southwest Florida
16	Water Management District shall be composed of 13 <u>elected</u>
17	members who must shall reside within the district. Members of
18	the governing boards shall be appointed by the Governor, subject
19	to confirmation by the Senate at the next regular session of the
20	Legislature, and the refusal or failure of the Senate to confirm
21	an appointment creates a vacancy in the office to which the
22	appointment was made.
23	(a) The term of office for a governing board member is 4
24	years and commences on March 2 following the previous general
25	<u>election</u> of the year in which the appointment is made and
26	terminates on March 1 of the fourth calendar year of the term or
27	may continue until a successor is appointed, but not more than
28	180 days. Terms of office of governing board members shall be
29	staggered to help maintain consistency and continuity in the

(b) Commencing January 1, 1999, the Covernor shall appoint 32 33 the following number of governing board members in each year of the Governor's 4-year term of office: 34 35 1. In the first year of the Governor's term of office, the 36 Covernor shall appoint three members to the governing board of 37 each district. 2. In the second year of the Governor's term of office, the 38 Governor shall appoint three members to the governing board of 39 40 the Southwest Florida Water Management District and two members 41 to the governing board of each other district. 42 3. In the third year of the Governor's term of office, the 43 Governor shall appoint three members to the governing board of 44 the Southwest Florida Water Management District and two members to the governing board of each other district. 45 46 4. Notwithstanding 66 the provisions of any other general or special law to the 67 68 contrary, vacancies in the governing boards of the water 69 management districts shall be filled according to the following 70 residency requirements, representing areas designated by the 71 United States Water Resources Council in United States 72 Geological Survey, River Basin and Hydrological Unit Map of 73 Florida-1975, Map Series No. 72:

(a) Northwest Florida Water Management District:

1. One member <u>must</u> shall reside in the area generally designated as the "Perdido River Basin-Perdido Bay Coastal Area-Lower Conecuh River-Escambia River Basin" hydrologic units and that portion of the "Escambia Bay Coastal Area" hydrologic unit which lies west of Pensacola Bay and Escambia Bay.

2. One member <u>must</u> shall reside in the area generally
designated as the "Blackwater River Basin-Yellow River BasinChoctawhatchee Bay Coastal Area" hydrologic units and that
portion of the "Escambia Bay Coastal Area" hydrologic unit which
lies east of Pensacola Bay and Escambia Bay.

One member must shall reside in the area generally 114 designated as the "Santa Fe Basin-Waccasassa River and coastal 115 area between Withlacoochee and Suwannee River" hydrologic units. 116 6. 169	9. One member shall be <u>elected</u> appointed at large from
