A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Prescription Drug Donation Program; amending s. 499.029, F.S.; renaming the Cancer Drug Donation Program as the Prescription Drug Donation Program; revising definitions; expanding the drugs and supplies that may be donated under the program; expanding the types of facilities and practitioners that may participate in the program; conforming provisions to changes in terminology; removing obsolete language relating to the adoption of initial rules; providing an effective date. Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: Section 499.029, Florida Statutes, is amended Section 1. to read: 499.029 Prescription Cancer Drug Donation Program .--This section may be cited as the "Prescription Cancer (1)Drug Donation Program Act." There is created a Prescription Cancer Drug Donation (2)Program within the department for the purpose of authorizing and facilitating the donation of prescription cancer drugs and supplies to eligible patients. As used in this section, the term: (3) (a) "Cancer drug" means a prescription drug that has been approved under s. 505 of the federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act and is used to treat cancer or its side effects or is used

"Cancer drug" does not include a 30 substance listed in Schedule II, Schedule III, Schedule IV, or Schedule V of s. 893.03. 31 (a) (b) "Closed drug delivery system" means a system in 32 33 which the actual control of the unit-dose medication package is 34 maintained by the facility rather than by the individual 35 patient. 36 "Dispensing practitioner" means a practitioner (b) registered under s. 465.0276. 37 "Donor" means a patient or patient representative who 38 (C) 39 donates prescription cancer drugs or supplies needed to administer prescription cancer drugs that have been maintained 40 41 within a closed drug delivery system; health care facilities, 42 nursing homes, hospices, or hospitals with closed drug delivery systems; or pharmacies, prescription drug manufacturers, medical 43 44 device manufacturers or suppliers, or wholesalers of 45 prescription drugs or supplies, in accordance with this section. The term "Donor" includes a physician licensed under chapter 458 46 47 or chapter 459 who receives prescription cancer drugs or supplies directly from a prescription drug manufacturer, 48 49 wholesale distributor, or pharmacy. 50 "Eligible patient" means a person who the department (d) 51 determines is eligible to receive prescription cancer drugs from 52 the program. "Participant facility" means a class II hospital 53 (e) pharmacy or dispensing practitioner that has elected to 54 55 participate in the program and that accepts donated prescription

(f) "Prescribing practitioner" means a physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459 or any other medical professional with authority under state law to prescribe <u>drugs</u> cancer medication.

(g) "Prescription drug" does not include a substance
 listed in Schedule II, Schedule III, Schedule IV, or Schedule V
 of s. 893.03.

(h) (g) "Program" means the <u>Prescription</u> Cancer Drug
 Donation Program created by this section.

67 (i) (h) "Supplies" means any supplies used in the

69 Any donor may donate prescription cancer drugs or (4) supplies to a participant facility that elects to participate in 70 71 the program and meets criteria established by the department for 72 such participation. Prescription Cancer drugs or supplies may 73 not be donated to a specific cancer patient, and donated 74 prescription drugs or supplies may not be resold by the 75 participant program. Prescription Cancer drugs billed to and 76 paid for by Medicaid in long-term care facilities that are 77 eligible for return to stock under federal Medicaid regulations 78 shall be credited to Medicaid and are not eligible for donation under the program. A participant facility may provide dispensing 79 and counseling consulting services to an eligible patient 80 individuals who is are not a patient patients of the participant 81 82 hospital.

(5) The <u>prescription</u> cancer drugs or supplies donated to the program may be prescribed only by a prescribing practitioner for use by an eligible patient and may be dispensed only by a pharmacist <u>or dispensing practitioner</u>.

(6) (a) A <u>prescription</u> cancer drug may only be accepted or dispensed under the program if the drug is in its original, unopened, sealed container, or in a tamper-evident unit-dose packaging, except that a <u>prescription</u> cancer drug packaged in single-unit doses may be accepted and dispensed if the outside packaging is opened but the single-unit-dose packaging is unopened with tamper-resistant packaging intact.

94 (b) A <u>prescription</u> cancer drug may not be accepted or 95 dispensed under the program if the drug bears an expiration date 96 that is less than 6 months after the date the drug was donated 97 or if the drug appears to have been tampered with or mislabeled 98 as determined in paragraph (c).

99 (c) <u>Before</u> Prior to being dispensed to an eligible 100 patient, the <u>prescription</u> cancer drug or supplies donated under 101 the program shall be inspected by a pharmacist <u>or dispensing</u> 102 <u>practitioner</u> to determine that the drug and supplies do not 103 appear to have been tampered with or mislabeled.

(d) A dispenser of donated <u>prescription</u> cancer drugs or
supplies may not submit a claim or otherwise seek reimbursement
from any public or private third-party payor for donated
<u>prescription</u> cancer drugs or supplies dispensed to any patient
under the program, and a public or private third-party payor is
not required to provide reimbursement to a dispenser for donated

(7) (a) A donation of prescription cancer drugs or supplies 112 113 shall be made only at a participant's participant facility. A 114 participant facility may decline to accept a donation. A participant facility that accepts donated prescription cancer 115 116 drugs or supplies under the program shall comply with all applicable provisions of state and federal law relating to the 117 118 storage and dispensing of the donated prescription cancer drugs or supplies. 119

(b) A participant facility that voluntarily takes part in the program may charge a handling fee sufficient to cover the cost of preparation and dispensing of prescription cancer drugs or supplies under the program. The fee shall be established in rules adopted by the department.

125 (8) The department, upon the recommendation of the Board 126 of Pharmacy, shall adopt rules to carry out the provisions of 127 this section. Initial rules under this section shall be adopted 128 no later than 90 days after the effective date of this act. The 129 rules shall include, but not be limited to:

(a) Eligibility criteria, including a method to determinepriority of eligible patients under the program.

(b) Standards and procedures for <u>participants</u> participant
 facilities that accept, store, distribute, or dispense donated
 <u>prescription</u> cancer drugs or supplies.

(c) Necessary forms for administration of the program,including, but not limited to, forms for use by entities that

donate, accept, distribute, or dispense <u>prescription</u> cancer
drugs or supplies under the program.

(d) The maximum handling fee that may be charged by a
participant facility that accepts and distributes or dispenses
donated prescription cancer drugs or supplies.

(e) Categories of <u>prescription</u> cancer drugs and supplies
that the program will accept for dispensing; however, the
department may exclude any drug based on its therapeutic
effectiveness or high potential for abuse or diversion.

(f) Maintenance and distribution of the participant
 facility registry established in subsection (10).

A person who is eligible to receive prescription 148 (9) 149 cancer drugs or supplies under the state Medicaid program or 150 under any other prescription drug program funded in whole or in part by the state, by any other prescription drug program funded 151 152 in whole or in part by the Federal Government, or by any other 153 prescription drug program offered by a third-party insurer, 154 unless benefits have been exhausted, or a certain prescription 155 cancer drug or supply is not covered by the prescription drug 156 program, is ineligible to participate in the program created 157 under this section.

(10) The department shall establish and maintain a participant facility registry for the program. The participant facility registry shall include the participant's participant facility's name, address, and telephone number. The department shall make the participant facility registry available on the department's website to any donor wishing to donate prescription cancer drugs or supplies to the program. The department's

website shall also contain links to <u>prescription</u> cancer drug manufacturers that offer drug assistance programs or free medication.

168 (11) Any donor of prescription cancer drugs or supplies, 169 or any participant in the program, who exercises reasonable care 170 in donating, accepting, distributing, or dispensing prescription 171 cancer drugs or supplies under the program and the rules adopted under this section is shall be immune from civil or criminal 172 173 liability and from professional disciplinary action of any kind 174 for any injury, death, or loss to person or property relating to such activities. 175

(12) A pharmaceutical manufacturer is not liable for any
claim or injury arising from the transfer of any prescription
cancer drug under this section, including, but not limited to,
liability for failure to transfer or communicate product or
consumer information regarding the transferred drug, as well as
the expiration date of the transferred drug.

(13) If any conflict exists between the provisions in this
 section and the provisions in this chapter or chapter 465, the
 provisions in this section shall control the operation of the
 Cancer Drug Donation program.
