An act relating to a review under the Open Government Sunset Review Act regarding campaign finance reports; amending s. 106.0706, F.S., relating to an exemption from public-records requirements for user identifications and passwords held by the Department of State and information entered into the department's electronic filing system in connection with the electronic filing of campaign finance reports; reorganizing the exemption and clarifying provisions; saving the exemption from repeal under the Open Government sunset Review Act; removing the scheduled repeal of the exemption; providing an effective date.

Section 1. Section 106.0706, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

106.0706 Electronic filing of campaign finance reports; public-records exemption confidentiality of information and draft reports.-

- (1) All user identifications and passwords held by the Department of State pursuant to s. 106.0705 are confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution.
- (2) (a) Information entered All records, reports, and files stored in the electronic filing system for purposes of

generating a report pursuant to s. 106.0705 is are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution.

(b) Information entered in the electronic filing system is no longer exempt once the report is generated and until such time as the report has been submitted as a filed with the Division of Elections report. This section is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2009, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 2009.
