A bill to be entitled

An act relating to breast cancer; creating a referral program within the Department of Health for the early detection and treatment of breast cancer; providing definitions; providing requirements for the program; requiring the department to provide clinical breast examinations and screening mammograms for low-income women between specified ages; requiring that the State Surgeon General annually report to the Legislature the rate of breast cancer morbidity and mortality in this state and the extent of participation in breast cancer screening; requiring the organizations providing testing and treatment services to report to the department the insurer of each underinsured woman who is tested; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Referral program for the early detection and treatment of breast cancer.—

- (1) As used in this section, the term:
- (a) "Department" means the Department of Health.
- (b) "Unserved or underserved populations" mean women who:
- 1. Have incomes at or below 200 percent of the federal poverty level for individuals;
- $\underline{\text{2. Do not have health insurance that covers breast cancer}}$ screenings; and
 - 3. Are between 19 and 64 years of age, inclusive.
 - (2) There is established, within existing appropriations, a

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referral program within the department for the early detection and treatment of breast cancer for the purpose of promoting screening, detection, and treatment of breast cancer among unserved or underserved populations, educating the public regarding breast cancer and the benefits of early detection, and providing counseling and referral services for the treatment of breast cancer.

- (3) The program shall include, but need not be limited to:
- (a) A public education and outreach initiative to publicize early detection services for breast cancer, the extent of coverage for such services by health insurers, the benefits of early detection of breast cancer, and the recommended frequency of screening services, including clinical breast examinations and mammography.
- (b) Education programs, including programs on the benefits of early detection of breast cancer and the recommended frequency of mammography.
- (c) A system to track and provide followup services for all women who are screened for breast cancer in the referral program, including, but not limited to, followup services for women who receive an abnormal screening test, referral of women to treatment when needed, and scheduling women to be screened at recommended screening intervals.
- (d) Assurance that all participating health care providers of breast cancer screening are in compliance with national and state legislative mandates for quality assurance.
- (4) The department shall provide unserved or underserved populations, within existing appropriations, through contracts with health care providers to provide clinical breast

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examinations and screening mammograms as recommended in the most current guidelines for breast cancer screening established by the United States Preventive Services Task Force.

- (5) The State Surgeon General shall report annually to the legislative committees that are responsible for public health legislation and appropriations. The report shall include, but need not be limited to, a description of the rate of breast cancer morbidity and mortality in this state and the extent of participation by women in breast cancer screening.
- (6) The organizations that provide the testing and treatment services in the referral program shall report to the department the insurer of each underinsured woman who is tested through the program in order to facilitate recoupment of the costs of services.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2009.
