Section 1. Section 1010.2155, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

- 1010.2155 Expenditures for classroom instruction.
- (1) Effective July 1, 2009, school districts shall spend a minimum of 70 percent of district operating funds on classroom instruction and school administrators shall spend a minimum of 70 percent of each school's budget on classroom instruction.
- (2) Each school district shall calculate annually the percentage of state-funded operating expenditures that support

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- (a) The numerator for this calculation shall be the sum of school district operating expenditures related to:
- 1. Salaries and benefits for instructional personnel, instructional specialists, and educational support personnel, as defined in s. 1010.215;
 - 2. Instructional materials and instructional supplies;
 - 3. Inservice teacher education; and
 - 4. Curriculum development.
- (b) The denominator for this calculation shall be the sum of state-funded school district operating expenditures, excluding student transportation and school food services.
- (3) The Department of Education shall develop a uniform calculation for determining classroom expenditure percentages and shall develop a common format for district reporting. School districts shall publish classroom expenditure information annually in the financial report required in s. 1010.215 and in the school report card required in s. 1008.34, and shall post the information on the school district's Internet website.

 Annual expenditure reports shall be published no later than December 15 for the prior school year.
- (4) The Department of Education shall analyze the expenditures of any school district that:
- (a) Fails to meet required classroom expenditure levels and receives a district grade of "C" or lower.
- (b) Meets the required classroom expenditure levels, but receives a district grade of "C" or lower.
- (c) Fails to meet the required classroom expenditure levels, but receives a grade higher than "C."

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(5) The district school board shall analyze the expenditures of any school that:

- (a) Fails to meet required classroom expenditure levels and receives a district grade of "C" or lower.
- (b) Meets the required classroom expenditure levels, but receives a district grade of "C" or lower.
- (c) Fails to meet the required classroom expenditure levels, but receives a grade higher than "C."

The department shall provide technical assistance in budget preparation and analysis to districts that fail to meet the required classroom expenditures and may provide technical assistance to any district upon request. The superintendent of schools of any district that fails to meet the minimum classroom expenditures shall appear before the State Board of Education to explain the financial and performance status of the district.

Such appearance shall occur no later than 60 days after release of the district expenditure report. The Commissioner of Education shall make written recommendations to the superintendent of schools and school board regarding expenditure revisions that may result in higher student achievement.

- (6) The school board shall provide technical assistance in budget preparation and analysis to principals of schools that fail to meet the required classroom expenditures. The school principal shall appear before the district school board to explain the financial and performance status of the school. Such appearance shall occur no more than 30 days after release of the school expenditure report.
 - (7) The State Board of Education may adopt rules pursuant
