<u>(d) (3)</u> Any tickets, other than the tickets <u>described</u> in <u>paragraph (a)</u>, <u>paragraph (b)</u>, <u>or paragraph (c)</u>, <u>which</u> <u>subsections (1) and (2)</u>, <u>that</u> are resold or offered through an Internet website, unless such website is authorized by the original ticket seller or makes and posts the following guarantees and disclosures through Internet web pages on which are visibly posted, or links to web pages on which are posted, text to which a prospective purchaser is directed before completion of the resale transaction:

1.-(a) The website operator guarantees a full refund of the amount paid for the ticket including any servicing, handling, or processing fees, if such fees are not disclosed, when:

a. 1. The ticketed event is canceled;

 $\underline{\text{b.2.}}$ The purchaser is denied admission to the ticketed event, unless such denial is due to the action or omission of the purchaser; or

 $\underline{\text{c.3.}}$ The ticket is not delivered to the purchaser in the manner requested and pursuant to any delivery guarantees made by the reseller and such failure results in the purchaser's inability to attend the ticketed event.

2.(b) The website operator discloses that it is not the issuer, original seller, or reseller of the ticket or items and does not control the pricing of the ticket or items, which may be resold for more than their original value.

(2) (4) Nothing in This section does not authorize authorizes any individual or entity to sell or purchase tickets at any price on property where an event is being held without

the prior express written consent of the owner of the property.

- (3) Any not-for-profit organization, as an original ticket issuer or seller of tickets subject to paragraph (1)(c), may prohibit ticket purchases for the purpose of remarketing or reselling, and may require binding contractual agreements with registered ticket resellers for the purpose of purchasing, remarketing, or reselling the event or entertainment tickets.
- $\underline{(4)}$ (5) Any sales tax due for resales under this section shall be remitted to the Department of Revenue in accordance with s. 212.04.
- (5) Any individual or entity found to be in violation of this section is liable to the state for a civil penalty equal to treble the amount of the transaction or transactions that were executed in violation of this section.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2009.
