

## LEGISLATIVE ACTION

Senate House

The Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs (Wise) recommended the following:

## Senate Amendment (with title amendment)

Between lines 64 and 65 insert:

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Section 4. Section 402.316, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

(Substantial rewording of section. See

s. 402.316, F.S., for present text.)

402.316 Religious exemption.—

- (1) This section may be cited as the "Zaniyah Hinson Act."
- (2) The provisions of ss. 402.301-402.319 do not apply to a child care facility or weekday preschool program if that program

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is an integral part of an established religious congregation or religious school that conducts regularly scheduled classes, courses of study, or educational programs and is a member or participant of, or accredited by, a state, regional, or national accrediting organization for religious exemption which is recognized by the department. However, the personnel of such facility or program must meet the screening requirements of ss. 402.305(2) and 402.3055.

- (3) The department shall recognize an accrediting organization for religious exemption for the purposes of this section if the organization complies with all of the following:
- (a) Adopts and publishes minimum standards for operating a child care facility or weekday preschool program that meets or exceeds the minimum standards set forth in s. 402.305 (1)-(11), (13), (15), and (16).
- (b) Requires a child care facility or weekday preschool program that is a member or participant of, or accredited by, the organization to:
- 1. Comply with the accrediting organization's minimum standards.
- 2. Meet the minimum requirements of the local governing body with respect to health, sanitation, and safety, including minimum requirements for environmental health, firesafety, zoning, and building codes, and comply with the local governing body with respect to the enforcement of those requirements.
- 3. Inform parents and guardians that the facility or program is exempt from state licensing requirements but meets the standards of an accrediting organization for religious exemption which meet or exceed the department's minimum



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- 4. Display its certificate of compliance issued by the accrediting organization in a conspicuous location. Failure to post the certificate must result in an administrative action by the accrediting organization as determined by the organization's standards.
- (4) The department shall facilitate an annual meeting of the accrediting organizations for religious exemption, health and safety officials, and other interested child advocates in order to exchange ideas for ensuring the health and safety of children in child care facilities and weekday preschool programs.
- (5) The department may not regulate or control an accrediting organization for religious exemption or regulate or control the governance, religious curriculum, academic curriculum, testing or assessments, evaluation procedures, academic requirements of staff, discipline, or hiring practices of any child care facility or weekday preschool program that is exempt from ss. 402.301-402.319 pursuant to this section.

An act relating to the regulation of child care programs and facilities; amending ss. 402.305, 402.313, and 402.3131, F.S.; requiring child care facilities, family day care homes, and large family child care homes to provide parents with certain

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information regarding the causes, symptoms, and transmission of the influenza virus; amending s. 402.316, F.S.; providing a short title; providing that a child care facility or weekday preschool program affiliated with a religious congregation or religious school and which is a member, participant, or accredited by an accrediting organization for religious exemption is exempt from regulation by the Department of Children and Family Services; providing an exception for the screening requirements for program personnel; requiring accrediting organizations recognized by the department to adopt and publish minimum standards that meet or exceed certain department standards; providing additional program requirements; requiring the department to facilitate an annual meeting; prohibiting the department from regulating accrediting organizations or certain specified elements of a religious-exempt child care program; providing an effective date.
