I. Summary:

The bill provides that the Northwest Florida and Suwannee River Water Management Districts may use any excess funds provided for the development of alternative water supplies for their regional water supply planning efforts.

The bill provides an effective date of July 1, 2009.

This bill substantially amends section 373.1961, Florida Statutes.

II. Present Situation:

Each water management district currently receives a portion of the funds deposited into the Water Protection and Sustainability Program Trust Fund within the Department of Environmental Protection. The amount of these funds is subject to annual appropriation and has recently been declining due to reduced documentary stamp tax revenues.

Of the funds deposited into the trust fund, 65 percent are directed to the water management districts for the implementation of alternative water supply efforts, as provided for in

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s. 373.1961, F.S. Section 373.1961(3), F.S., provides for the distribution of the funds to the individual districts and authorized uses of the funds.

Section 373.1961(3)(c), F.S., directs that these funds are to be combined with other state funds and used to assist in funding the project construction costs of alternative water supply projects. This paragraph also provides that, if a district has not completed a regional water supply plan or the plan has identified that no need exists for alternative water supply projects, then the district may utilize the funds for water resource development projects including springs protection.

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

The bill amends s. 373.1961, F.S., to authorize the Northwest Florida and Suwannee River Water Management Districts to utilize excess alternative water supply funds for the development of regional water supply plans in addition to those currently authorized.

The bill provides an effective date of July 1, 2009.
