40 (a) The department shall develop a Choose Life license  
41 plate as provided in this section. The word "Florida" must  
42 appear at the bottom of the plate, and the words "Choose Life"  
43 must appear at the top of the plate.

44 (b) The annual use fees shall be distributed quarterly to  
45 Choose Life, Inc., a s. 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation, with a  
46 list of annually to each county in the ratio that the annual use

49 (c) Up to 10 percent of the fees may be used for

66 2. Choose Life, Inc., may, from time to time, establish

177 disabilities throughout the state and to operate and establish  
178 programs to support individuals with autism and related  
179 disabilities through direct services, evaluation, training, and  
180 awareness. Achievement and Rehabilitation Centers, Inc., shall  
181 establish an Autism Services Grant Council that shall provide

257 plate, and the words "Discover Florida's Horses" must appear at  
258 the bottom of the plate.

259 (b) The annual use fees shall be distributed to the  
260 Florida Agriculture Center and Horse Park Authority created by  
261 s. 570.952, which shall retain all proceeds until all startup  
262 costs for developing and establishing the plate have been

285 Inc., a s. 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, which shall  
286 administer the fees as follows:

287 1. The St. Johns River Alliance, Inc., shall retain the  
288 first \$60,000 of the annual use fees as direct reimbursement for  
289 administrative costs, startup costs, and costs incurred in the  
290 development and approval process. Thereafter, up to 10 percent

314 words "Endless Summer" must appear at the bottom of the plate.

315 (b) The license plate annual use fees shall be distributed  
316 to Surfing's Evolution & Preservation Corporation to fund its  
317 activities, programs, and projects aimed at preserving the sport  
318 of surfing. Surfing's Evolution & Preservation Corporation may  
319 retain all revenue from the annual use fees until all startup

341 department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the  
342 plate, and the words "Catch Me, Release Me" must appear at the  
343 bottom of the plate.

344 (b) The license plate annual use fees shall be distributed  
345 to the Guy Harvey Ocean Foundation, Inc., to fund marine-related  
346 scientific research, including research of free-ranging pelagic  
347 marine species that inhabit, use, or migrate through Florida

363 the top of the plate, and the words "Fraternal Order of Police"

365 (b) In order to purchase the Fraternal Order of Police  
366 license plate, a person must submit a certified letter from the  
367 Florida State Lodge of the Fraternal Order of Police showing  
368 that he or she qualifies for the use of the Fraternal Order of  
369 Police law enforcement emblem by being a member in good  
370 standing.

371 (c) The license plate annual use fees shall be distributed  
372 to the Florida State Lodge Fraternal Order of Police Memorial  
373 Foundation to fund its activities, programs, and projects aimed  
374 at preserving, maintaining, and expanding the Florida Fraternal  
375 Order of Police Law Enforcement Memorial. The Florida State
