The word "Florida" must 73 appear at the bottom of the plate, and the words "Choose Life" 74 must appear at the top of the plate. 75 (b) The annual use fees shall be distributed quarterly to 76 Choose Life, Inc., a s. 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation, with a 77 list of annually to each county in the ratio that the annual use 78 fees collected by each county bears to the total fees collected 79 for the plates within the state. 80 (c) Up to 10 percent of the fees may be used for administrative costs directly associated with the operations of 81 Choose Life, Inc., and activities by Choose Life, Inc., to 82 83 promote adoption and to market the license plate in this state. 84 Choose Life, Inc., shall administer distribution of the

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85 <u>remaining Each county shall distribute the</u> funds to 86 nongovernmental, not-for-profit agencies within the county, 87 which agencies' services <u>primarily consist of</u> are limited to 88 counseling and meeting the physical needs of pregnant women who 89 are <u>considering</u> <del>committed to</del> placing their children for 90 adoption.

91 <u>1.</u> Funds may not be distributed to any agency that is 92 involved or associated with abortion activities, including 93 counseling for or referrals to abortion clinics, providing 94 medical abortion-related procedures, or proabortion advertising, 95 and funds may not be distributed to any agency that charges 96 women for services received.

2. Choose Life, Inc., may, from time to time, establish 97 98 criteria pertaining to appropriate percentages of expenditures 99 on items including, but not limited to, physical needs of women, 100 physical needs of infants awaiting adoption, counseling, 101 advertising, and training. 102 3. Choose Life license plate funds generated in counties 103 that do not have a qualified service provider shall be 104 distributed by Choose Life, Inc., to qualified service providers 105 in other counties. 106

4. Funds shall not be removed from a county with active
 qualified service providers for distribution to service
 providers in other counties unless year-end unused fund balances
 exceed 20 percent of the county's annual Choose Life license
 plate revenues for 3 consecutive years. If year-end fund
 balances exceed 20 percent of a county's annual revenues for 3
 consecutive years, such balance may be distributed by Choose

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113	Life, Inc., to qualified service providers in other counties.
114	1. Agencies that receive the funds must use at least 70
115	percent of the funds to provide for the material needs of
116	pregnant women who are committed to placing their children for
117	adoption, including clothing, housing, medical care, food,
118	utilities, and transportation. Such funds may also be expended
119	on infants awaiting placement with adoptive parents.
120	2. The remaining funds may be used for adoption,
121	counseling, training, or advertising, but may not be used for
122	administrative expenses, legal expenses, or capital
123	expenditures.
124	5.3. Each service provider agency that receives such funds
125	must submit an annual attestation to Choose Life, Inc., which
126	shall, upon request, make copies available to a state agency

131	6. Choose Life license plate use fees generated in this
132	state may only be spent on activities within this state.
133	(d)1. Within 90 days after the effective date of this
134	paragraph, county commissions that have never distributed Choose
135	Life funds shall forward such funds to Choose Life, Inc., for
136	distribution.
137	2. Within 180 days after the effective date of this
138	paragraph, county commissions that have been distributing Choose
139	Life funds shall forward fund balances to Choose Life, Inc., for
140	distribution.

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141 (32)UNITED WE STAND LICENSE PLATES.--142 (b) The department shall retain all revenues from the sale 143 of such plates until all startup costs for developing and 144 issuing the plates have been recovered. Thereafter, 145 notwithstanding s. 332.14, 100 percent of the annual use fee 146 shall be distributed to the Department of Transportation SAFE 147 Council for the development and implementation of programs to 148 fund a grant program to enhance security at airports throughout 149 the state, pursuant to s. 332.14. Up to 10 percent of the annual 150 use fee revenue may be used for administration, promotion, and marketing of the plate, including annual audit and compliance 151 152 affidavit costs.

(35) FLORIDA GOLF LICENSE PLATES.--

(a) The Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles
shall develop a Florida Golf license plate as provided in this
section. The word "Florida" must appear at the bottom of the
plate. The Dade Amateur Golf Association, following consultation
with the PGA TOUR, the Florida Sports Foundation, the LPGA, and
the PGA of America may submit a revised sample plate for
consideration by the department.

161 The department shall distribute the Florida Golf (b) 162 license plate annual use fee to the Dade Amateur Golf 163 Association, a s. 501(c)(3) organization Florida Sports 164 Foundation, a direct-support organization of the Office of 165 Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development. The license plate 166 annual use fees are to be annually allocated as follows: 167 1. Up to 10  $\frac{1}{2}$  percent of the proceeds from the annual use fees may be used by the Dade Amateur Golf Association Florida 168

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169 Sports Foundation for the administration of the Florida Junior 170 Youth Golf Program.

171 2. The Dade Amateur Golf Association shall receive the 172 first \$80,000 in proceeds from the annual use fees for the 173 operation of youth golf programs in Miami-Dade County. 174 Thereafter, 15 percent of the proceeds from the annual use fees 175 shall be provided to the Dade Amateur Golf Association for the 176 operation of youth golf programs in Miami-Dade County.

177 3. The remaining proceeds from the annual use fees shall 178 be available for grants to nonprofit organizations to operate 179 youth golf programs and for marketing the Florida Golf license 180 plates. All grant recipients, including the Dade Amateur Golf Association, shall be required to provide to the Dade Amateur 181 182 Golf Association Florida Sports Foundation an annual program and 183 financial report regarding the use of grant funds. Such reports 184 shall be made available to the public.

(c) The <u>Dade Amateur Golf Association shall</u> Florida Sports Foundation may establish a Florida <u>Junior Golf Council</u> Youth Colf Program. The Florida <u>Junior Golf Council</u> Youth Colf Program shall assist organizations for the benefit of youth, introduce young people to golf, instruct young people in golf, teach the values of golf, and stress life skills, fair play, courtesy, and self-discipline.

(d) The <u>Dade Amateur Golf Association</u> Florida Sports
 Foundation shall establish a seven-member <u>Florida Junior Golf</u>
 <u>Council</u> committee to offer advice regarding the distribution of
 the annual use fees for grants to nonprofit organizations. The
 <u>council</u> advisory committee shall consist of one member from a

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197 group serving youth, one member from a group serving disabled 198 youth, and five members at large.

(69) AUTISM LICENSE PLATES.--

(a) The department shall develop an Autism license plate
 as provided in this section. Autism license plates must bear the
 colors and design approved by the department. The word "Florida"
 must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Support
 Autism Programs" must appear at the bottom of the plate.

205 (b) The proceeds from the license plate annual use fee 206 shall be distributed to Achievement and Rehabilitation Centers, 207 Inc., to fund service programs for autism and related 208 disabilities throughout the state and to operate and establish 209 programs to support individuals with autism and related 210 disabilities through direct services, evaluation, training, and 211 awareness. Achievement and Rehabilitation Centers, Inc., shall establish an Autism Services Grant Council that shall provide 212 213 grants from available Autism license plate proceeds to nonprofit 214 organizations for direct services and programs for individuals 215 with autism and related disabilities and their families. 216 Consideration for participation in such services and programs 217 shall be given to applicants who are children or adults with 218 autism and related disabilities and their families and shall 219 include those who are on the Agency for Persons with 220 Disabilities waiting lists for services. Achievement and 221 Rehabilitation Centers, Inc., shall also establish an Autism 222 License Plate Fund. Moneys in the fund shall be used by the 223 grant council as provided in this paragraph. All funds received 224 under this subsection must be used in this state.

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225	(c) Achievement and Rehabilitation Centers, Inc., may
226	retain all proceeds from the annual use fee up to \$85,000 until
227	all documented startup costs for developing and establishing the
228	plate have been recovered. Thereafter, the proceeds from the
229	annual use fee shall be used as follows:
230	1. Up to 10 percent of the proceeds from the annual use
231	fee may be used for the cost of administration, marketing, and
232	promotion of the Autism License Plate Fund, the Autism Services
233	Grant Council, and related matters, including annual audit and
234	compliance affidavit costs.
235	2. Funds may be used as necessary for annual audit or
236	compliance affidavit costs.
237	3. Thirty-five percent of the proceeds from the annual use
238	fee shall be used to establish and operate programs to support
239	individuals with autism and related disabilities and their
240	families through direct services, evaluation, training, and
241	awareness in the state.
242	4. The Center for Autism and Related Disabilities at the
243	University of Miami shall receive 15 percent of the proceeds
244	from the annual use fee for distribution, as determined
245	appropriate by the director of that center, to the seven
246	regional autism centers created under s. 1004.55. The regional
247	centers shall use the proceeds to support the services they
248	provide.
249	5. The remaining proceeds from the annual use fee shall be
250	available to the Autism Services Grant Council for grants to
251	nonprofit organizations to operate direct services programs for
252	individuals with autism and related disabilities and their
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253 families. All grant recipients, including Achievement and Rehabilitation Centers, Inc., and the Center for Autism and 254 255 Related Disabilities, shall be required to provide to the Autism 256 Services Grant Council an annual program and financial report 257 regarding the use of grant funds. Such reports shall be made 258 available to the public. 259 (d) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, 260 the first \$10,000 in proceeds generated from voluntary 261 contributions to the Autism License Plate Fund authorized in ss. 262 320.02 and 322.08 shall be retained by the department to offset 263 the department's implementation costs. 264 (70) LET'S GO SURFING LICENSE PLATES.--265 The department shall develop a Let's Go Surfing (a) 266 license plate as provided in this section. Let's Go Surfing 267 license plates must bear the colors and design approved by the 268 department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the 269 plate, and the words "Let's Go Surfing" must appear at the 270 bottom of the plate. (b) 271 The license plate annual use fees shall be distributed 272 to East Coast Surfing Hall of Fame and Museum, Inc., to fund 273 activities, programs, and projects to promote Florida's surfing-274 related tourism, preserve Florida's surfing history and 275 heritage, preserve Florida's surf and shores, and honor lifequards who patrol Florida's surf and shores to protect 276 beachgoers, surfers, and others. East Coast Surfing Hall of Fame 277 278 and Museum, Inc., may retain all revenue from the annual use 279 fees until all startup costs for developing and establishing the 280 plate have been recovered. Thereafter, up to 10 percent of the

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281 annual use fee revenue may be used for administration, 282 promotion, and marketing of the plate, including annual audit 283 and compliance affidavit costs. 284 (71) FLORIDA HORSE PARK LICENSE PLATES.--285 The department shall develop a Florida Horse Park (a) 286 license plate as provided in this section. Florida Horse Park 287 license plates must bear the colors and design approved by the 288 department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Discover Florida's Horses" must appear at 289 290 the bottom of the plate. 291 The annual use fees shall be distributed to the (b) 292 Florida Agriculture Center and Horse Park Authority created by 293 s. 570.952, which shall retain all proceeds until all startup 294 costs for developing and establishing the plate have been 295 recovered. Thereafter, the proceeds shall be used as follows: 296 1. A maximum of 10 percent of the proceeds from the annual 297 use fees may be used for the administration, promotion, and 298 marketing of the Florida Horse Park license plate. 299 2. The remaining proceeds shall be used by the authority 300 to promote the Florida Agriculture Center and Horse Park located 301 in Marion County; to support continued development of the park, 302 including the construction of additional educational facilities, 303 barns, and other structures; to provide improvements to the 304 existing infrastructure at the park; and to provide for 305 operational expenses of the Florida Agriculture Center and Horse 306 Park. 307 (72) ST. JOHNS RIVER LICENSE PLATES.--308 The department shall develop a St. Johns River license (a)

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309 plate as provided in this section. St. Johns River license 310 plates must bear the colors and design approved by the 311 department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the 312 plate, and the words "St. Johns River" must appear at the bottom 313 of the plate. 314 The requirements of s. 320.08053 must be met prior to (b) 315 the issuance of the plate. Thereafter, the license plate annual 316 use fees shall be distributed to the St. Johns River Alliance, 317 Inc., a s. 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, which shall 318 administer the fees as follows: 319 1. The St. Johns River Alliance, Inc., shall retain the 320 first \$60,000 of the annual use fees as direct reimbursement for 321 administrative costs, startup costs, and costs incurred in the 322 development and approval process. Thereafter, up to 10 percent 323 of the annual use fee revenue may be used for administrative 324 costs directly associated with education programs, conservation, 325 research, and grant administration of the organization and for 326 promotion and marketing of the specialty license plate. 327 2. At least 30 percent of the fees shall be available for 328 competitive grants for targeted community-based or county-based 329 research or projects for which state funding is limited or not 330 currently available. The remaining 50 percent shall be directed 331 toward community outreach and access programs. The competitive 332 grants shall be administered and approved by the board of 333 directors of the St. Johns River Alliance, Inc. A grant advisory 334 committee shall be composed of six members chosen by the St. 335 Johns River Alliance board members. 336 3. Any remaining funds shall be distributed with the

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337 approval of and accountability to the board of directors of the 338 St. Johns River Alliance, Inc., and shall be used to support 339 activities contributing to education, outreach, and springs 340 conservation. 341 ENDLESS SUMMER LICENSE PLATES.--(73) 342 The department shall develop an Endless Summer license (a) 343 plate as provided in this section. Endless Summer license plates 344 must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The 345 word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the 346 words "Endless Summer" must appear at the bottom of the plate. 347 (b) The license plate annual use fees shall be distributed 348 to Surfing's Evolution & Preservation Corporation to fund its 349 activities, programs, and projects aimed at preserving the sport 350 of surfing. Surfing's Evolution & Preservation Corporation may 351 retain all revenue from the annual use fees until all startup 352 costs for developing and establishing the plate have been 353 recovered. Thereafter, up to 10 percent of the annual use fee 354 revenue may be used for promotion and marketing of the specialty 355 license plate and administrative costs directly associated with 356 the corporation's programs and the specialty license plate. 357 Surfing's Evolution & Preservation Corporation shall use the 358 remaining funds as follows: 359 1. To fund the proposed Surfing's Evolution & Preservation 360 Experience project. 361 2. To provide funds for the provision of lifequards or the 362 building of artificial reefs. 3. 363 To provide funds to organizations that house the 364 history and artifacts of surfing or promote the sport through

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365	exhibits, lectures, and events.
366	4. To support programs and events of other organizations
367	that support beaches and oceans and promote education on beach
368	safety, coastal pollution, and beach ecology.
369	(74) CATCH ME, RELEASE ME LICENSE PLATES
370	(a) The department shall develop a Catch Me, Release Me
371	license plate as provided in this section. Catch Me, Release Me
372	license plates must bear the colors and design approved by the
373	department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the
374	plate, and the words "Catch Me, Release Me" must appear at the
375	bottom of the plate.
376	(b) The license plate annual use fees shall be distributed
377	to the Guy Harvey Ocean Foundation, Inc., to fund marine-related
378	scientific research, including research of free-ranging pelagic
379	marine species that inhabit, use, or migrate through Florida
380	waters; conservation initiatives; and education and public
381	outreach programs targeting school-aged children in the state.
382	The Guy Harvey Ocean Foundation, Inc., may retain all revenue up
383	to \$60,000 from the annual use fees until all startup costs for
384	developing and establishing the plate have been recovered.
385	Thereafter, up to 10 percent of the annual use fee revenue may
386	be used for administrative costs directly associated with the
387	operations of the Guy Harvey Ocean Foundation, Inc., and up to
388	10 percent may be used for promotion and marketing of the
389	specialty license plate.
390	(75) FRATERNAL ORDER OF POLICE LICENSE PLATES
391	(a) The department shall develop a Fraternal Order of
392	Police license plate as provided in this section. Fraternal
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393 Order of Police license plates must bear the colors and design 394 approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at 395 the top of the plate, and the words "Fraternal Order of Police" 396 must appear at the bottom of the plate. 397 In order to purchase the Fraternal Order of Police (b) 398 license plate, a person must submit a certified letter from the 399 Florida State Lodge of the Fraternal Order of Police showing 400 that he or she qualifies for the use of the Fraternal Order of 401 Police law enforcement emblem by being a member in good 402 standing. 403 The license plate annual use fees shall be distributed (C) 404 to the Florida State Lodge Fraternal Order of Police Memorial 405 Foundation to fund its activities, programs, and projects aimed 406 at preserving, maintaining, and expanding the Florida Fraternal 407 Order of Police Law Enforcement Memorial. The Florida State 408 Lodge of the Fraternal Order of Police may retain all revenue 409 from the annual use fees until all startup costs for developing 410 and establishing the plate have been recovered. Thereafter, up 411 to 10 percent of the annual use fee revenue may be used for 412 promotion and marketing of the specialty license plate and 413 administrative costs directly associated with memorial programs 414 and the specialty license plate. The Florida State Lodge 415 Fraternal Order of Police Memorial Foundation shall use the 416 remaining funds as follows: 417 To fund the Florida State Fraternal Order of Police Law 1. 418 Enforcement Memorial projects. 419 To provide funds for the expansion, maintenance, and 2. 420 support of the Florida State Lodge Fraternal Order of Police Page 15 of 22

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421 Memorial Foundation. 422 3. To provide funds to organizations that help support the 423 families of law enforcement officers who have died in the line 424 of duty. 425 4. To support programs and events that support the Florida 426 Fraternal Order of Police Law Enforcement Memorial. 427 (76) GO GREEN FLORIDA LICENSE PLATES.--428 (a) The department shall develop a Go Green Florida 429 license plate as provided in this section. Go Green Florida 430 license plates must bear the colors and design approved by the 431 department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the 432 plate, the words "Go Green" must appear on the bottom of the 433 plate, and the "Go Green Florida" emblem or logo must appear on 434 the plate. 435 (b) The requirements of s. 320.08053 must be met prior to 436 the issuance of the plate. The annual use fees shall be 437 distributed to the Coalition for Renewable Energy Solutions, 438 Inc. After reimbursement for documented costs expended to 439 establish the plate, the proceeds of the annual use fees shall 440 be used in the following manner: 441 1. Up to 10 percent may be used by the Coalition for Renewable Energy Solutions, Inc., for <u>administrative</u>, promotion, 442 443 and marketing costs. 444 2. The remainder shall be used to fund the Renewable 445 Energy and Energy-Efficient Technologies Grants Program pursuant to s. 377.804, the Solar Energy System Incentives Program 446 447 pursuant to s. 377.806, under the Florida Energy and Climate 448 Commission, or other educational programs dedicated to providing

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449	effective alternative energy practices.
450	(c) The coalition shall comply with the financial audit
451	requirements of s. 320.08062.
452	(d) The "Go Green Florida" emblem or logo may be
453	authorized for use by the department in recognition of energy-
454	efficient vehicle usage and practices. The display of the decal
455	for energy-efficient practices may not be considered a
456	substitute for a legal license tag.
457	(77) FLORIDA BIODIVERSITY FOUNDATION LICENSE PLATES
458	(a) The department shall develop a Florida Biodiversity
459	Foundation license plate as provided in this section. Florida
460	Biodiversity Foundation license plates must bear the colors and
461	design approved by the department. The word "Florida" must
462	appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Save Wild
463	Florida" must appear at the bottom of the plate.
464	(b) The annual use fees shall be distributed to the
465	Florida Biodiversity Foundation, Inc., which shall retain 50
466	percent of the proceeds until the startup costs to develop and
467	establish the plates have been recovered. Thereafter, the
468	proceeds shall be used as follows:
469	1. A maximum of 10 percent of the proceeds may be used to
470	fund the administrative, promotion, and marketing costs of the
471	license plate program and the foundation.
472	2. The remaining fees shall be used by the foundation to
473	fund research, education, and scientific study of the diversity
474	of animals and plants and to aid in the preservation, study,
475	conservation, and recovery of imperiled organisms.
476	Section 3. Paragraphs (h) and (i) are added to subsection
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477 (15) of section 320.02, Florida Statutes, to read: 478 320.02 Registration required; application for 479 registration; forms.--480 (15)481 The application form for motor vehicle registration (h) 482 and renewal of registration must include language permitting a 483 voluntary contribution of \$5 to the Autism License Plate Fund 484 administered by Achievement and Rehabilitation Centers, Inc. 485 Except as provided in s. 320.08058(69)(d), such contributions 486 must be distributed by the department each month to the Autism 487 License Plate Fund administered by Achievement and 488 Rehabilitation Centers, Inc., to be used as provided in s. 489 320.08058(69). 490 The application form for motor vehicle registration (i) and renewal of registration must include language permitting a 491 492 voluntary contribution of \$1 to Ronald McDonald Houses of 493 Florida. Section 320.0706, Florida Statutes, is amended 501 to read: 320.0706 Display of license plates on trucks.--The owner 502 503 of any commercial truck of gross vehicle weight of 26,001 pounds 504 or more shall display the registration license plate on both the

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505 front and rear of the truck in conformance with all the 506 requirements of s. 316.605 that do not conflict with this 507 section. The owner of a dump truck may place the rear license 508 plate on the gate no higher than 60 inches to allow for better 509 visibility. However, the owner of a truck tractor shall be 510 required to display the registration license plate only on the 511 front of such vehicle. The owner of any wrecker issued a regular 512 wrecker license plate shall display the license plate only on 513 the front of the vehicle. Subsection (78) is added to section 320.08058, 562 Florida Statutes, to read: 563 Specialty license plates.--320.08058 564 (78) HISPANICS SETTLED FLORIDA IN 1565 LICENSE PLATES.--565 The department shall develop a Hispanics Settled (a) 566 Florida in 1565 license plate as provided in this section. 567 (b) Hispanics Settled Florida in 1565 license plates must 568 bear the colors and design approved by the department. The word 569 "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "HISPANICS SETTLED FLORIDA" must appear at the bottom of the 570 571 plate. 572 The department shall retain all revenues from the sale (C) 573 of such plates until all startup costs for developing and issuing the plates have been recovered. Thereafter, 50 percent 574 575 of the annual use fees shall be distributed to National Hispanic 576 Corporate Achievers, Inc., an organization in Orlando that 577 sponsors minority job fairs. The remaining 50 percent shall be 578 distributed to Florida Hispanic Foundation.
