Senate Memorial

A memorial to the Congress of the United States, urging Congress to pass legislation that establishes a national universal health care program with a comprehensive range of benefits.

WHEREAS, every person deserves access to affordable quality health care, and $% \left(1\right) =\left(1\right) +\left(1\right$

WHEREAS, the number of Floridians without health insurance totals approximately 4 million, and

WHEREAS, in 2007, health care spending in the United States averaged \$7,421 per person, the health care portion of the national gross domestic product reached 16.2 percent, and health care spending grew at 6.1 percent to \$2.2 trillion, and

WHEREAS, the United States has the most expensive health care system in the world in terms of absolute costs, per capita costs, and percentage of the gross domestic product, and

WHEREAS, health care costs continue to increase, jeopardizing the security of working families and small businesses, and

WHEREAS, despite being first in spending, the World Health Organization has ranked the United States health care system 37th among all nations, and

WHEREAS, among the 30 industrialized nations, only the United States does not have a national universal health care program, and

WHEREAS, studies have found that citizens of countries with a national universal health care program have more physician visits and hospital stays than in the United States, and

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WHEREAS, in January 2004, the Institute of Medicine of the National Academy of Sciences issued a report calling for a national universal health care program in the United States and recommended that health care coverage be universal, continuous, affordable, and sustainable for individuals and families, and determined that such coverage should be designed to enhance the health and well-being of citizens of the United States by promoting access to high-quality health care that is effective, efficient, safe, timely, patient-centered, and equitable, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

That the Congress of the United States is requested to enact legislation that provides for health care coverage for all Americans that includes coverage for preventive health care, physician services, dental care, hospital services, maternity care, mental health services, long-term care, and prescription medications and has affordable cost sharing and a reasonable limit on out-of pocket expenses.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be dispatched to the President of the United States, to the President of the United States Senate, to the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, and to each member of the Florida delegation to the United States Congress.
