The Board of Governors shall submit a report detailing 59 (3) 60 the funding methodology developed pursuant to subsection (2) to 61 the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of 62 the House of Representatives no later than February 1, 2010. 63 (4) The Board of Governors shall use the funding 64 methodology developed pursuant to subsection (2) to develop the 65 legislative budget request for 4-year Doctor of Medicine degree programs at state universities. For the 2010-2011 fiscal year, 66 the Board of Governors shall submit by March 1, 2010, an amended 67 68 legislative budget request based on the funding methodology. 69 Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

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
