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2009 executive officer from establishing academic programs for which academic credit is awarded; requiring that the chief executive officer appoint faculty and staff, not representatives of the institute, to carry out certain responsibilities of the research institute; providing that such faculty and staff receive compensation, benefits, and

responsibilities of the research institute; providing that 33 34 such faculty and staff receive compensation, benefits, and 35 terms of service consistent with university policy; 36 deleting the chief executive officer's reporting 37 relationship to the Board of Governors; deleting the chief 38 executive officer's responsibility to submit an annual operating budget to the Governor, Cabinet, the chair of 39 40 the Board of Governors, and the Legislature; abolishing the council of scientific advisers created by the board of 41 42 directors; deleting the requirements for submitting 43 applications for Alzheimer's disease research funding; 44 deleting the statement that the not-for-profit corporation 45 and its subsidiaries are not agencies within the meaning of s. 20.03, F.S.; specifying the sources of funding for 46 47 the institute; requiring that any appropriation to the 48 institute be expended for certain purposes; deleting the 49 requirement that an appropriation to the research 50 institute be paid directly to the board of directors; 51 deleting obsolete provisions; deleting provisions 52 providing for the expiration of the institute; providing an effective date. 53 54

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57 Section 1. Section 1004.445, Florida Statutes, is amended 58 to read:

59 1004.445 Johnnie B. Byrd, Sr., Alzheimer's Center and

(1) The Johnnie B. Byrd, Sr., Alzheimer's Center and
Research Institute is established within at the University of
South Florida.

(2) The research institute has a statewide mission to
 advance research, education, treatment, prevention, and the
 early detection of Alzheimer's disease and is responsible for
 distributing competitive grant funds for Alzheimer's disease
 research.

The State Board of Education shall enter into an 69 (3)(2)(a) 70 agreement for the utilization of the facilities on the campus of 71 the University of South Florida to be known as the Johnnie B. 72 Byrd, Sr., Alzheimer's Center and Research Institute, including 73 all furnishings, equipment, and other chattels used in the 74 operation of those facilities, with A Florida not-for-profit corporation is created to act as an instrumentality of the state 75 76 organized solely for the sole purpose of managing governing and 77 operating the Johnnie B. Byrd, Sr., Alzheimer's Center and 78 Research Institute. This not-for-profit corporation, acting as 79 an instrumentality of the state, shall govern and operate the 80 Johnnie B. Byrd, Sr., Alzheimer's Center and Research Institute 81 in accordance with the terms of the agreement between the State 82 Board of Education and the not-for-profit corporation. The notfor-profit corporation may, with the prior approval of the Board 83 84 of Governors, create either for-profit or not-for-profit Page 3 of 13

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85 corporate subsidiaries, or both, to fulfill its mission. The 86 not-for-profit corporation and its subsidiaries may are 87 authorized to receive, hold, invest, and administer property and 88 any moneys acquired from private, local, state, and federal 89 sources, as well as technical and professional income generated 90 or derived from practice activities of the institute, for the 91 benefit of the institute and the fulfillment of its mission. 92 Effective July 1, 2007, the agreement authority provided to the 93 State Board of Education is transferred to the Board of 94 Governors.

95 The affairs of the not-for-profit corporation shall be (b) 96 managed by a board of directors who shall serve without 97 compensation. The board of directors shall consist of seven 98 members. Four members shall be appointed by the chair of the 99 board of trustees the President of the University of South 100 Florida and three members shall be appointed as follows: the 101 chair of the Board of Governors, or their designees, five 102 representatives of the state universities, and nine 103 representatives of the public who are neither medical doctors 104 nor state employees. Each director who is a representative of a 105 state university or of the public shall be appointed to 106 term of 3 years. The chair of the board of directors shall be 107 selected by a majority vote of the directors. Each director 108 shall have only one vote. Of the five university 109 representatives, one shall be appointed by the Governor, one two 110 by the President of the Senate, and one two by the Speaker of 111 the House of Representatives. Each member of the board of directors shall be appointed to a 5-year term beginning July 1, 112

114 representatives, three shall be appointed by the Governor, three 115 by the President of the Senate, and three by the Speaker of the 116 House of Representatives. Any vacancy in office shall be filled 117 in the same manner as the original appointment. Any director may 118 be reappointed.

119 <u>(4)(3)</u> The board of <u>directors</u> Governors shall provide in 120 the agreement with the not-for-profit corporation for the 121 following:

(a) Approval by the Board of Governors of the articles of
 incorporation of the not-for-profit corporation.

(b) Approval by the Board of Governors of the articles of
incorporation of any not-for-profit corporate subsidiary created
by the not-for-profit corporation.

(c) <u>The use</u> Utilization of lands, facilities, and personnel by the not-for-profit corporation and its subsidiaries for research, education, treatment, prevention, and the early detection of Alzheimer's disease and for mutually approved teaching and research programs conducted by the University of South Florida or other accredited medical schools or research institutes.

(d) Preparation of an annual financial audit pursuant to
s. 11.45 of the not-for-profit corporation's accounts and the
accounts of any subsidiaries to be conducted by an independent
certified public accountant. The annual audit report shall
include management letters and shall be submitted to the Auditor
General and the Board of Governors for review. The Board of

Analysis and Government Accountability <u>may</u> shall have the authority to require and receive from the not-for-profit corporation and any subsidiaries, or from their independent auditor, any detail or supplemental data relative to the operation of the not-for-profit corporation or subsidiary.

(e) Provision by the not-for-profit corporation and its subsidiaries of equal employment opportunities for all persons regardless of race, color, religion, gender, age, or national origin.

(f) The appointment of an advisory panel to the board of directors and the chief executive officer for the purposes of providing advice and advocacy in meeting the institute's statewide mission, engaging community leaders and other concerned members of the public in supporting the institute's mission, raising public awareness of Alzheimer's disease, and soliciting philanthropic support for the institute.

157 (5) (4) The board of directors of the not-for-profit 158 corporation may Governors is authorized to secure comprehensive 159 general liability protection, including professional liability 160 protection, for the not-for-profit corporation and its 161 subsidiaries, pursuant to s. 1004.24. The not-for-profit 162 corporation and its subsidiaries shall be exempt from any 163 participation in any property insurance trust fund established 164 by law, including any property insurance trust fund established pursuant to chapter 284, so long as the not-for-profit 165 166 corporation and its subsidiaries maintain property insurance 167 protection with comparable or greater coverage limits. 168 In the event that the agreement between the not-for

169 profit corporation and the Board of Governors is terminated for 170 any reason, the Board of Governors shall assume governance and 171 operation of the facilities.

(6) The institute shall be administered by a chief executive officer, who shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the board of directors of the not-for-profit corporation, and who shall exercise the following powers and duties, subject to the approval of the board of directors:

(a) The chief executive officer shall establish programs
that fulfill the mission of the institute in research,
education, treatment, prevention, and early detection of
Alzheimer's disease; however, the chief executive officer may
not establish academic programs for which academic credit is
awarded and which culminate in the conferring of a degree,
without prior approval of the Board of Governors.

184 (b) The chief executive officer shall have control over 185 the budget and the moneys appropriated or donated to the 186 institute from private, local, state, and federal sources, as 187 well as technical and professional income generated or derived 188 from practice activities of the institute. However, professional 189 income generated by university faculty from practice activities 190 at the institute shall be shared between the institute and the 191 university as determined by the chief executive officer and the 192 appropriate university dean or vice president.

(c) The chief executive officer shall appoint <u>faculty and</u>
<u>staff</u> representatives of the institute to carry out the
research, patient care, and educational activities of the
institute. This appointed faculty and staff shall receive and

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197 establish the compensation, benefits, and terms of service that 198 are consistent with university policy of such representatives. 199 Representatives of the institute shall be eligible to hold 200 concurrent appointments at affiliated academic institutions. 201 University faculty shall be eligible to hold concurrent 202 appointments at the institute.

(d) The chief executive officer shall have control over the use and assignment of space and equipment within the facilities.

(e) The chief executive officer shall have the power to
 create the administrative structure necessary to carry out the
 mission of the institute.

209 (f) The chief executive officer shall have a reporting 210 relationship to the Board of Governors or its designee.

211 (f) (g) The chief executive officer shall provide a copy of 212 the institute's annual report to the Governor and Cabinet, the 213 President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of 214 Representatives, and the chair of the Board of Governors. The 215 annual report shall describe the expenditure of all funds and 216 shall provide information regarding research that has been 217 conducted or funded by the institute center, as well as the 218 expected and actual results of such research.

(h) By August 1 of each year, the chief executive officer shall develop and submit to the Governor and Cabinet, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the chair of the Board of Governors an annual operating budget detailing the planned use of state, federal, and private funds for the fiscal year.

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225 (7) The board of directors of the not-for-profit 226 corporation shall create a council of scientific advisers to the 227 chief executive officer comprised of leading researchers, 228 physicians, and scientists. The council shall review programs 229 and recommend research priorities and initiatives to maximize the state's investment in the institute. The members of the 230 231 council shall be appointed by the board of directors of the not-232 for-profit corporation. Each member of the council shall be 233 appointed to serve a 2-year term and may be reappointed to the 234 council. 235 (8) (a) Applications for Alzheimer's disease research 236 funding may be submitted from any university or established 237 research institute in the state. All qualified investigators in 238 the state, regardless of institutional affiliation, shall have 239 equal access and opportunity to compete for the research 240 funding. Grants shall be awarded by the board of directors of the not-for-profit corporation on the basis of scientific merit, 241 242 as determined by an open, competitive peer review process that 243 ensures objectivity, consistency, and high quality. The 244 following types of applications shall be considered for funding: 1. Investigator-initiated research grants. 245 246 Institutional research grants. 2. 247 3. Collaborative research grants, including those that 248 advance the finding of cures through basic or applied research. (b) Preference may be given to grant proposals that foster 249 collaboration among institutions, researchers, and community 250 practitioners because these proposals support the advancement of 251 252 cures through basic or applied research, including clinical Page 9 of 13

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253	trials involving Alzheimer's patients and related networks.
254	(c) To ensure that all proposals for research funding are
255	appropriate and are evaluated fairly on the basis of scientific
256	merit, the board of directors of the not-for-profit corporation,
257	in consultation with the council of scientific advisors, shall
258	appoint a peer review panel of independent, scientifically
259	qualified individuals to review the scientific content of each
260	proposal and establish its scientific priority score. The
261	priority scores shall be forwarded to the council and must be
262	considered by the board of directors of the not-for-profit
263	corporation in determining which proposals shall be recommended
264	for funding.
265	(d) The council of scientific advisors and the peer review
266	panel shall establish and follow rigorous guidelines for ethical
267	conduct and adhere to a strict policy with regard to conflict of
268	interest. All employees, members of the board of directors, and
269	affiliates of the not-for-profit corporation shall follow the
270	same rigorous guidelines for ethical conduct and shall adhere to
271	the same strict policy with regard to conflict of interest. A
272	member of the council or panel may not participate in any
273	discussion or decision with respect to a research proposal by

(a) Personal identifying information relating to clients
of programs created or funded through the Johnnie B. Byrd, Sr.,
Alzheimer's Center and Research Institute that is held by the
institute, the University of South Florida, the Board of
Governors, or the State Board of Education;

(b) Medical or health records relating to patients held bythe institute;

(c) Materials that relate to methods of manufacture or production, potential trade secrets, potentially patentable material, actual trade secrets as defined in s. 688.002, or proprietary information received, generated, ascertained, or discovered during the course of research conducted by or through the institute and business transactions resulting from such research;

300 (d) The personal identifying information of a donor or 301 prospective donor to the institute who wishes to remain 302 anonymous; and

303 (e) Any information received by the institute from a 304 person from another state or nation or the Federal Government 305 that is otherwise confidential or exempt pursuant to the laws of 306 that state or nation or pursuant to federal law. 307

309 confidential and exempt information in order to perform its 310 duties and responsibilities shall have access to such 311 information.

(8) 312 The institute's budget shall include the moneys 313 appropriated in the General Appropriations Act, donated, or 314 otherwise provided to the institute from private, local, state, 315 and federal sources as well as technical and professional income 316 generated or derived from practice activities at the institute. 317 Any appropriation to the institute shall be expended for the 318 purposes specified in this section, including conducting and 319 supporting research and related clinical services, awarding 320 institutional grants and investigator-initiated research grants 321 to other persons within the state through a competitive process, 322 developing and operating integrated data projects, providing 323 assistance to the memory disorder clinics established in s. 324 430.502, and providing for the operation of the institute.

325 (11) Any appropriation to the institute provided in a
 326 general appropriations act shall be paid directly to the board
 327 of directors of the not-for-profit corporation by warrant drawn
 328 by the Chief Financial Officer from the State Treasury.

329 (12) By June 1, 2009, the Division of Statutory Revision 330 of the Office of Legislative Services shall certify to the 331 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of 332 Representatives the language and statutory citation of this 333 section, which is scheduled to expire January 1, 2011.

334 (13) The Legislature shall review the performance, the 335 outcomes, and the financial management of the Johnnie B. Byrd, 336 Sr., Alzheimer's Center and Research Institute during the 2010 Page 12 of 13

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337	Regular Session of the Legislature and shall determine the most
338	appropriate funding source and means of funding the center and
339	institute based on its review.
