HB 465 2009

A bill to be entitled

An act relating to umbilical cord blood banking; requiring the Department of Health to prepare and distribute a publication regarding the process, options, medical uses, risks, and benefits of umbilical cord blood collection; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

- Section 1. (1) The Department of Health shall prepare an educational publication that contains standardized, objective information regarding umbilical cord blood banking that is sufficient to allow a pregnant woman to make an informed decision about whether to participate in a public or private umbilical cord blood banking program, including:
- (a) An explanation of the differences between public and private umbilical cord blood banking.
- (b) The medical processes involved in the collection of umbilical cord blood.
- (c) The medical risks to the mother and her newborn child associated with umbilical cord blood collection.
- (d) The options available to a mother relating to stem cells that are contained in the umbilical cord blood after the delivery of her newborn, including:
- 1. Donating the stem cells to a public umbilical cord blood bank;
- 2. Storing the stem cells in a family or private umbilical cord blood bank for use by family members;

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3. Storing the stem cells for family use through a family or sibling donor banking program that provides free collection, processing, and storage when there is a medical need; or

4. Discarding the stem cells.

- (e) The current and potential future medical uses, risks, and benefits of umbilical cord blood collection to a mother, her newborn child, and her biological family.
- (f) The current and potential future medical uses, risks, and benefits of umbilical cord blood collection to persons who are not biologically related to a mother or her newborn child.
- (g) Any costs that may be incurred by a pregnant woman who chooses to make an umbilical cord blood donation.
- (h) Medical or family history criteria that could impact a family's consideration of umbilical cord blood banking.
- (i) Options for ownership and future use of the donated umbilical cord blood.
- (j) The average cost of public and private umbilical cord blood banking.
- (2) The department shall update the publication as necessary.
- (3) The department shall distribute the publication free of charge to health care providers on request and shall make the publication available on its website in a printable format.
- (4) The department shall encourage health care and maternal care professionals providing health care services to a pregnant woman, when those health care services are directly related to her pregnancy, to provide the pregnant woman with the publication by the end of her second trimester or as soon as

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- (a) A person described in this subsection is not required to distribute the publication if the action conflicts with the person's religious beliefs and the person makes this fact known to the mother as soon as feasible.
- (b) A person described in this subsection who fails to distribute the publication is not subject to discipline by the appropriate licensing agency and a cause of action is not created by any failure to distribute the publication as required by this section.
- (5) The department shall begin distribution of the publication no later than January 1, 2010.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2009.
