| 21 | that he cannot afford, and he has had multiple surgeries to |
| 22 | correct torn ligaments in both knees, and |
| 23 | WHEREAS, after the knee surgeries, Mr. Miller had to be |
| 24 | rehospitalized several times due to complications, including |
| 25 | deep-venous thrombosis and pulmonary embolism, and |
| 26 | WHEREAS, according to his orthopedic surgeon, Steven |
| 27 | Wender, M.D., Mr. Miller will require knee replacements on both |
| 28 | legs over the next 40 years of his life every 7 to 13 years, at |
| 29 | a cost of approximately \$100,000 per surgery, and is likely to |
