4 Between lines 166 and 167, insert:

5 Section 1. Section 381.0203, Florida Statutes, is amended  
6 to read:

7 381.0203 Pharmacy services.--

8 (1) The department may contract on a statewide basis for  
9 the purchase of drugs, as defined in s. 499.003, for utilization  
10 ~~to be used~~ by state agencies and political subdivisions, and may  
11 adopt rules to administer this section.

12 (2) The department may establish and maintain a pharmacy  
13 services program that includes, ~~including~~, but is not limited  
14 to:

15 (a) A central pharmacy to support pharmaceutical services  
16 provided by the county health departments, including

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17 pharmaceutical repackaging, dispensing, and the purchase and  
18 distribution of immunizations and other pharmaceuticals.

19 (b) Regulation of drugs, cosmetics, and household products  
20 pursuant to chapter 499.

21 (c) Consultation to county health departments as required  
22 by s. 154.04(1)(c).

23 (d) A contraception distribution program which shall be  
24 implemented, to the extent resources permit, through the  
25 licensed pharmacies of county health departments. A woman who is  
26 eligible for participation in the contraceptive distribution  
27 program is deemed a patient of the county health department.

28 1. To be eligible for participation in the program a woman  
29 must:

30 a. Be a client of the department or the Department of  
31 Children and Family Services.

32 b. Be of childbearing age with undesired fertility.

33 c. Have an income between 150 and 200 percent of the  
34 federal poverty level.

35 d. Have no Medicaid benefits or applicable health  
36 insurance benefits.

37 e. Have had a medical examination by a licensed health  
38 care provider within the past 6 months.

39 f. Have a valid prescription for contraceptives that are  
40 available through the contraceptive distribution program.

41 g. Consent to the release of necessary medical information  
42 to the county health department.

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43           2. Fees charged for the contraceptives under the program  
44 must cover the cost of purchasing and providing contraceptives  
45 to women participating in the program.

46           3. The department may adopt rules to administer this  
47 program.
