2 An act relating to motor vehicle registration; providing
3 for the implementation of a certain litigation settlement;
4 providing eligibility and procedures to collect a credit
5 on new or renewal registrations; providing a funding
6 mechanism for the credit; requiring the credit amounts to
7 be deducted from specified moneys deposited into the
8 General Revenue Fund; authorizing recipients to return the
9 credit; providing for expiration; providing an effective
10 date.

12 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

14 Section 1. Implementation of litigation settlement
15 provisions of Collier v. Dickinson.--

16 (1) Any person who held a driver's license, identification
17 card, or motor vehicle registration that was valid between June
18 1, 2000, and September 30, 2004, is eligible to receive a single
19 \$1 credit on a new or renewed motor vehicle registration between
20 July 1, 2009, and June 30, 2010.

21 (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of s. 320.08046,
22 Florida Statutes, the 58 percent of the surcharge levied under
23 s. 320.08046, Florida Statutes, that is to be deposited into the
24 General Revenue Fund pursuant to that section shall be used to
25 fund the \$1 credit authorized in subsection (1).

26 (3) Eligible recipients may elect to return their credit.

27 (4) This section expires July 1, 2011.

28 Section 2. Section 320.08046, Florida Statutes, reads:

29 320.08046 Surcharge on license tax; General Revenue
30 Fund.--There is levied on each license tax imposed under s.
31 320.08, except those set forth in s. 320.08(11), a surcharge in
32 the amount of \$1, which shall be collected in the same manner as
33 the license tax. Of the proceeds of the license tax surcharge,
34 58 percent shall be deposited into the General Revenue Fund and
35 42 percent shall be deposited into the Grants and Donations
36 Trust Fund in the Department of Juvenile Justice to fund the
37 community juvenile justice partnership grants program.

38 Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2009.
