The ESE Guaranteed Allocation funds are provided in addition to the funds for each exceptional student in the per FTE student calculation. Each district's ESE Guaranteed Allocation for the 2009-2010 appropriation shall not be recalculated during the school year. School districts that provided educational services in 2008-2009 for exceptional students who are residents of other districts shall not discontinue providing such services without the prior approval of the Department of Education. Expenditure requirements for the ESE Guaranteed Allocation shall be as prescribed in section 1010.20(3), Florida Statutes, for programs for exceptional students.

From the funds provided in Specific Appropriations 5B and 76, the value of 43.35 weighted FTE students is provided to supplement the funding for severely handicapped students served in ESE programs 254 and 255 when a school district has less than 10,000 FTE student enrollment
