(a) The student must successfully complete academic coursesas follows:

Three middle school or higher courses in English. These
 courses shall emphasize literature, composition, and technical
 text.

20 2. Three middle school or higher courses in mathematics.
21 Each middle school must offer at least one high school level
22 mathematics course for which students may earn high school

24 3. Three middle school or higher courses in social studies, 25 one semester of which must include the study of state and 26 federal government and civics education. 4. Three middle school or higher courses in science.

5. One course in career and education planning to be completed in 7th or 8th grade. The course may be taught by any member of the instructional staff; must include career exploration using <u>Florida</u> CHOICES for the 21st Century or a comparable cost-effective program; must include educational planning using the online student advising system known as

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42 Florida Academic Counseling and Tracking for Students at the 43 Internet website FACTS.org; and shall result in the completion 44 of a personalized academic and career plan.

46 Each school must hold a parent meeting either in the evening or 47 on a weekend to inform parents about the course curriculum and 48 activities. Each student shall complete an electronic personal 49 education plan that must be signed by the student; the student's 50 instructor, guidance counselor, or academic advisor; and the 51 student's parent. By January 1, 2007, The Department of 52 Education shall develop course frameworks and professional 53 development materials for the career exploration and education 54 planning course. The course may be implemented as a stand-alone 55 course or integrated into another course or courses.
