101.6103 Mail ballot election procedure.--

8 (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (7), the 9 supervisor of elections shall mail all official ballots with a 10 secrecy envelope, a return mailing envelope, and instructions 11 sufficient to describe the voting process to each elector 12 entitled to vote in the election not sooner than the 20th day 13 before the election and not later than the 10th day before the 14 date of the election. All such ballots shall be mailed by firstclass mail. The return mailing envelope must include a postage 15 paid indicia paid by the supervisor. 20 Section 29. Subsection (2) of section 101.64, Florida 21 Statutes, is amended, and subsection (5) is added to that 22 section, to read:

101.64 Delivery of absentee ballots; envelopes; form.--

24 The certificate shall be arranged on the back of the (2)25 mailing envelope so that the line for the signature of the 26 absent elector is across the seal of the envelope; however, no 27 statement shall appear on the envelope which indicates that a 28 signature of the voter must cross the seal of the envelope. The 29 absent elector shall execute the certificate on the envelope. The supervisor may not place on the mailing envelope any 30 31 information indicating the voter's party affiliation or noparty-affiliation status.

33 (5) The mailing envelope for each absentee ballot must 34 include a postage paid indicia paid by the supervisor.

35 Section 30. Subsection (1) of section 101.657, Florida 36 Statutes, is amended to read:

101.657 Early voting.--

38 (1) (a) As a convenience to the voter, the supervisor of 39 elections shall allow an elector to vote early in the main or 40 branch office of the supervisor. The supervisor shall mark, code, indicate on, or otherwise track the voter's precinct for 41 each early voted ballot. 46 The supervisor may also designate any city hall or (b) 47 permanent public library facility as an early voting site. The results or tabulation of 51 52 votes cast during early voting may not be made before the close 53 of the polls on election day. Results shall be reported by 54 precinct.

For purposes of a special election held pursuant to s. 70 100.101, early voting shall begin <u>at 7 a.m.</u> on the 8th day 71 before an election and end <u>at 9 p.m.</u> on the 2nd day before an 72 election.
