An act relating to school food service programs; amending s. 1006.06, F.S.; revising provisions relating to school food service programs; requiring that the Department of Education calculate and distribute a school district breakfast supplement for each school year by multiplying the state breakfast rate by the number of free and reduced-price breakfast meals served; requiring that the Legislature provide sufficient funds in the General Appropriations Act to reimburse participating school districts for the difference between the average federal reimbursement for free and reduced-price breakfasts and the average statewide cost for breakfasts; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraphs (b) and (h) of subsection (5) of section 1006.06, Florida Statutes, are amended, and paragraph (i) is added to that subsection, to read:

1006.06 School food service programs.—

(b) Beginning with the 2009-2010 school year, each school district must annually set prices for breakfast meals at rates that, combined with federal reimbursements and state allocations, are sufficient to defray costs of school breakfast programs without requiring allocations from the district's operating funds, except if the district school board approves

(h) The department shall <u>calculate and distribute a</u> annually allocate among the school districts funds provided from the school <u>district</u> breakfast supplement <u>for each school year by</u> multiplying the state breakfast rate as specified in the General Appropriations Act <u>by the based on each district's total</u> number of free and reduced-price breakfast meals served.

(i) The Legislature shall provide sufficient funds in the General Appropriations Act to reimburse participating school districts for the difference between the average federal reimbursement for free and reduced-price breakfasts and the average statewide cost for breakfasts.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2009.
