21	exceeding sixty days and, with the approval of two members of
22	the cabinet, grant full or conditional pardons, restore civil
23	rights, commute punishment, and remit fines and forfeitures for
24	offenses.
25	(b) Except in cases of treason, the legislature may enact
26	laws to suspend or remit fines and forfeitures, grant reprieves
27	not exceeding sixty days, restore civil rights, and commute
28	punishments.
29	<u>(c)</u> In cases of treason the governor may grant reprieves
