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A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Legislative Auditing Committee; requiring the committee to direct the Auditor General or the Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability to conduct a study of certain economic development projects; specifying study criteria; requiring a report to the Legislature by a time certain; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. (1) The Legislative Auditing Committee shall direct the Auditor General or the Office of Program Policy

Analysis and Government Accountability to conduct a study of the application and approval process for any economic development project funded through the Quick Action Closing Fund under s.

288.1088, Florida Statutes, that involves establishing and operating a digital production studio to create digital imagery for animated feature films, live actions films, and television commercials and create video games. At a minimum, the study shall determine whether:

- (a) All questions that were asked in the application to the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development or Enterprise Florida, Inc., were answered truthfully and completely.
- (b) All financial information required by law to be provided by the applicant was in fact provided and truthful.

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(c) There was sufficient creditable information provided by the applicant to enable the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development or Enterprise Florida, Inc., to realistically conclude that projected job creation goals could be met by the project and whether the operating management of the applicant had exhibited a history of similar jobs creation in the past.

- (d) The business background of the operating management of the applicant was provided in a complete and truthful manner.
- (e) The applicant demonstrated a sufficiently strong balance sheet to ensure its continuation as a going concern.
- (f) The applicant was involved in any wrongful termination lawsuit and, if any, whether the lawsuit was properly examined and considered in judging the credibility of the applicant.
- (2) The study shall be completed, and a report of the results of the study shall be presented to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, not later than the start of the 2010 Regular Session of the Legislature.
- Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
